ORIGIN OF NATIONS.

Persian history claims that the Persians are descended from Perseus and Andromeda.

The Finns were at first the Fenns, or Fen men, who dwelt in the marshes north of the Baltic sea. They were conquered by the Russians in the twelfth century.

The Saxons appeared in the fourth century as a warlike German tribe. Their name was derived, it is supposed, from the seax, a heavy battle-axe, which was their favorite weapon.

The Latins are first mentioned as a nation of people under the rule of Latinus, 1240 B. C. They inhabited the central regions of Italy about midway between the Alps and the southern extremity.

The Corsicans of the present day are descended from Phoenicians, Greeks, Carthaginians, Romans, Vandals, Goths, Visigoths, Arabians, Italians and French. According to Seneca the aborigines were "robbers, liars and atheists."

The Russians are believed to have originated from a Slavonian tribe called the Roxilani about the Christian era. At a later date they were also called Muscovites, from Moscow, their leading city. The state was founded by Rurik, 862 A. D.

The English are first mentioned in history as the Angles, a German tribe inhabiting a portion of the seacoast between Denmark and Holland. The first English king who ruled in England was Egbert, in 828, who at Hengest-down defeated the natives in 835 and firmly established his authority in most of the eastern half of the island.—St. Louis Republic.
