Ch'town Council And Local 501 Sign Labor Agreement

What was termed by Hon. A.A. MacIsaac, Minister of Labor, as the final step towards the acceptance of labor by the people of Charlottetown occurred last night when officials of Local 501 Union and City Council signed a labor agreement involving civic employees.

Councillors received copies of the agreement in advance of the special meeting and the resolution proposing the carrying of the bill was passed unanimously.

City Recorder K.M. Martin, following a question by Councillor Foster regarding the chief disagreements of the agreement, noted that the main problem regarded the seniority clause.

The new agreement states that seniority will now depend on length of service of an employee. The former system had department heads deciding on their senior officials.

Gives Graphic Picture Of Mine Disaster

Presenting a graphic first hand picture of the mine tragedy at Springhill, Mrs. Evelyn Cudmore, Director of Red Cross Water Safety and First Aid Services for the Island who had just returned from the scene, spoke of the unfortunate conditions which prevail there in an address delivered to the Centennial Y's Men's Club at the Y.M.C.A. last evening.

Making direct reference to the efforts of the draegermen and bare-faced miners working at the pithead, the speaker stated that food and work clothing were being supplied by the Red Cross Disaster Fund to the members of these rescue squads during and after each shift on a round the clock schedule.

Assistance is also being given by the Red Cross to the families of the miners. Mrs. Cudmore emphasized that already many of the miners families were out of food and money and were in dire need of help.

Besides having received aid from private sources and institutions, these families are now receiving direct and immediate emergency assistance from the
