CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable. NORTH: A J 5 4 3, A 8 2, A 8 6, 10 5. WEST: 7, J 5 3, Q J 10 7 3, Q 9 7 2. EAST: Q 10 8 6, Q 10 9 4, 5 2, K 6 4. SOUTH: K 9 2, K 7 6, K 9 4, A J 8 3.

4-1. If the spades break 3-2, any method of play will produce at least four spade tricks and the contract. Declarer therefore should devote his efforts to dealing with the hand on the supposition the spades are divided 4-1. Starting the spades by playing the king first does not protect against the possibility East may have Q-10-x, though it does cover the case where West has the four spades.

When West shows out, declarer finds himself in difficulties. Against the best defense, all he can do is capture three spade tricks, two hearts, two diamonds and a club to go down one.

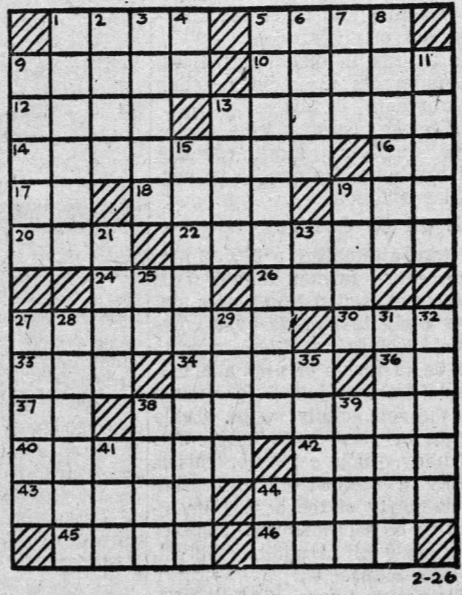
