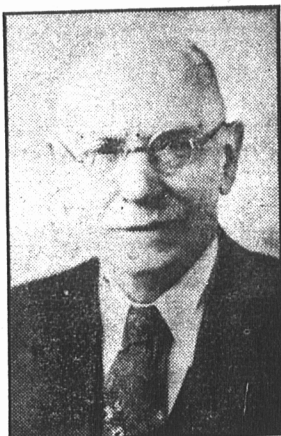


# Active Leaders of Commerce



F. S. JONES

D. R. H. SHAW

Of the well known firm of Stanley, Shaw & Peardon, Charlottetown, was born in Brackley Point, P. E. Member of Canadian Legion; member of National Conservative Association; member of Board of the Charlottetown Hospital. Past president of the Holy Name Society, Holy Redeemer Parish of the Roman Catholic Church.



G. FRANK HUTCHESON
