EARLY SPRING FLOWERS.—George Carter, Esq., has now blooming in his garden on Pownall Street a large number of beautiful hyacinths, tulips and crocuses which he planted last autumn. A hundred hyacinth bulbs, in a circle, planted five inches apart in rows the same distance apart, make a radiant and delightfully scented centre-piece, while the tulips and crocuses occupy the border. Many persons suppose that these flowers will not live out in winter. But this is evidently a mistake, in view of the beautiful early spring flowers which are blooming in Mr. Carter's garden.

SHOULD BE ATTENDED TO.—The attention of civic officials is directed to a well, on Hillborough Street, between Sydney and Richmond Streets. This well is covered with loose plank. GENERAL TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

TORONTO, May 24.—Principal Grant having expressed the hope that Sir Oliver Mowat would be sustained, the Empire publishes a long article to-day severely censuring the Kingston divine, accusing the reverend gentleman of seeking notoriety, and advising him to study up Ontario affairs before delivering himself thus.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 24.—Representative Chickering, of New York, addressed the house committee on foreign affairs to-day in support of his bill to authorize the president to adopt retaliatory measures against Canada by suspending transportation of goods through the United States under bond when the United States commissioners discriminated against one of the border canals.

BREMEN, May 24.—An extra meeting of the stockholders of the North German Lloyd Steamship Co. took place here to-day. The president of the committee of control proposed that the meeting authorize the council to raise a loan of fifteen million marks, because their steamships in the South American trade were of relatively small carrying capacity, and the increasing competition of modern steamers proved that the former were growing unfit for much further service. Therefore it was imperative that they should speedily be replaced. The proposal of the president of the council of control was unanimously adopted without debate.

NEW YORK, May 24.—The village of Flatland, L. I., is excited because Bessie and Ruby, handmaiden, twenty-year-old twins, young daughters of Farmer Dandsworth, have eloped, and with the wrong Ruby ran off with Bessie's intended husband on the very evening of the day set for the wedding, and Bessie, in a moment of pique, eloped with a former flame a few days after her sister's disappearance. The old farmer made a bonfire of his daughter's belongings, and declared that they should never more cross the threshold of his house.

MARTIN'S FERRY, Ohio, May 23.—An immense mass meeting of striking miners was held here to-day. Delegations of several hundreds each, with flags and banners, marched ten and fifteen miles to attend. Several speakers proposed that the Ohio miners should march to the West Virginia mines and force the working miners out.

LONDON, May 24.—A despatch from Sydney, N. S. W., says: "Advises from Samoa are that the rebels hold the strong position previously occupied by Tannasee, and declare they are prepared to try conclusions with the German war ship Dalk."

WASHINGTON, May 24.—Senator Perkins to-day introduced in the senate, a bill intended to grant the use of Springfield rifles and their equipments now on hand and not needed for use by the regular army, to the militia of the various states and territories. These arms are to be distributed upon the requisition of the governors of the various states, but are to remain the property of the United States.

NEW YORK, May 24.—The investigation of the police department here was resumed by the State Senate committee yesterday. Mr. Goff, counsel for the commission, created a sensation this afternoon, by calling to the stand Gordon Granger, son-in-law of Police Com. McClave. Granger testified that a man named Cooper paid \$250 to get on the police force; that he (Granger) got \$5 of it, and N. J. Dixon, McClave's bookkeeper, got the rest of it. Granger then told of several men who were under the height required by the police regulations, but who were appointed to the force after paying the usual \$30 each. Commissioner McClave became greatly excited and shouted, pointing to Granger, "This man is a liar, a thief, a drunkard, and a forger."

LONDON, May 24.—A despatch from Pretoria says that Wesleyan ministers named Underwood and Woryden have been arrested in the Transvaal for making sedition addresses and inciting disorders. The excitement over English settlers into the army by the Boers increase and public subscriptions have been started to raise funds for the defence of persons arrested for opposing the government's action.

MADRID, May 24.—Intensely cold weather accompanied by high winds, prevail throughout Spain. Some districts have been visited by heavy snow storms, seriously damaging crops, blocking railways, etc.

NASHVILLE, Tenn., May 24.—The southern Presbyterian assembly yesterday rejected a proposal of the northern church for the appointment of a committee of conference on the subject of organic union.

PARIS, May 24.—The Temps and Debats publish hostile comments on the new Anglo-Belgian treaty as to the African territory. They say the treaty gives the Congo state access to the valley of the Upper Nile, while assuring to Great Britain the strip of territory between Lake Albert Edward and Tanganyika. Such a violation of the rights of Egypt and France," says Debats, "is impossible to permit."
