Steel Industry's 100th Ann. Marked By Special Sculpture

Monday marked the 100th anniversary of the pouring of the first commercial heat of Bessemer steel and the beginning of the "Second Century of Steel" in North America.

C. H. Drury, president, Doeco Steel Limited, announced that Doeco Steel is joining steel companies in the U.S., Canada and Latin America in celebrating the significant event by setting aside a specimen of Monsey's first "heat" of steel.

Specimens from the Montreal, Quebec, and Sydney, Nova Scotia, plants of Doeco, and more than 150 other steel plants are to be sent to the Battelle Memorial Institute in Columbus, Ohio, where they will be smelted into a single heat of steel. This ingot will be used as part of a symbol of "The Second Century of Steel" which will be designed by the winning sculptor in a contest between the top sculptors in America. The symbol will be placed permanently at the Smithsonian Institute in Washington.

The first commercial heat of steel in North America by the Bessemer process was produced in September 1864 in a small experimental plant of the Kelly Pneumatic Process Company at Wyandotte, Michigan. The Bessemer process boosted the rate of steel production to about 10 tons an hour. Before that, steel had been made by a tedious hand labor in small crucibles; and it

today finds the industry marketing a host of versatile new products undreamed of until a few years ago. Modern steels are thinner, lighter and stronger than those available previously. And they are helping to streamline the design and shape of innumerable products and structures using steel.

"Strength has always been one of steel's most important properties," Mr. Drury said, "giving it a key advantage over competitive materials. Today's steel is stronger than ever. The strongest material commercially available today is steel wire with tensile strength of nearly 600,000 pounds per square inch. Within 10 years, steel research teams hope to do even better than that — developing steel that will have the phenomenal strength of 800,000 pounds per square inch!"
