

our own Northwest. Taking that view of the matter, I find, as I have said, a large quantity of American fish comes into Canada, and the United States have received some advantages in this regard.

The people of Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto and Hamilton, and all the large cities in the west, are supplied with oysters from the United States, and we are able to sell a comparatively small proportion of our fish.

I know there is a bill before Congress at the present time, providing that several articles of Canadian production be admitted duty free or at a low duty, and I know it is part of the policy of the Government, and is embodied in the Tariff Act, that when the duty is taken off Canadian articles, similar duties will be removed here.
