

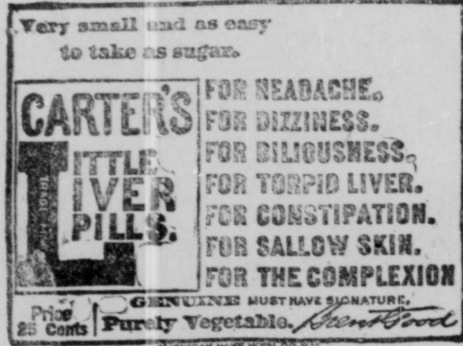

2ND DISTRICT OF QUEEN'S.

Convention in the City Yesterday.

MELLISH and GALLANT

To Oppose Farquharson and Douglass.

A convention of delegates representing the different polls of the Second Electoral District of Queen's was held in the Lyceum yesterday. The convention was called to order by L. L. Jenkins, Esq., convener, who explained that they had met to nominate candidates to contest the district at the forthcoming election in the interests of the Opposition.

Upon motion, Mr. Ernest Harris was appointed secretary, and a nominating committee was struck as follows: Thomas Doyle, chairman; William Rodd, Joseph Wise, Dugald Currie, Thomas Tremere, George Sherrin, Thomas Oxenham, Angus N. McLeod, Thomas Cass and Dr. R. Macneill.

While the committee were deliberating the meeting was addressed by Mr. A. C. Shaw who moved the following resolution:—

Resolved, That this convention cannot but view with alarm the large increase of the public debt and controllable expenditure of this province and the consequent undue taxation of the people under the Liberal government that has been in power in this province since 1891, and we hereby desire to place on record our demand for the strictest economy in the administration of the government of P. E. Island.

The motion was seconded by Neil McNeill and unanimously adopted. The following resolution was then moved by Mr. Thomas Oxenham seconded by Mr. John Andrews and unanimously adopted:—

Resolved, That we condemn the iniquity practiced upon the Fort Augustus District by Mr. Frederick Peters and demand a change in the

election laws of the Province whereby such conduct shall in future be impracticable as well as all villainous "machine" acts.

It was moved by Mr. Arthur Wright, seconded by Mr. A. C. Shaw, and carried unanimously:—

Resolved, That we deplore and condemn the system of keeping the accounts of the Province whereby during the last session of our local Parliament it was proved the alleged sinking fund to pay our debentures was a falsified concern and a myth, and no such fund was in existence as provided for by law but the money deposited on call in the Merchants' Bank of Halifax; such conduct demands that Mr. Farquharson's government be deprived of power, for if they are false in one matter they are false in all, and further revelations are yet in store for the people.

The following resolution was moved by Mr. Thomas Doyle seconded by Mr. N. McNeill, and unanimously adopted:—

Resolved, That we condemn the present road act and its management under supervisors as a machine for furthering the political ends of partizans and corruptionists, and demand the complete reform of this service and that all contracts shall, after public notice, be open to free competition.

It was moved by Mr. N. McNeill seconded by Mr. Stephen Coles and unanimously adopted:—

Resolved, That the taxes now levied by the present government are unduly high upon town and country and before any more taxes are levied we demand a rigid investigation into every branch of the public service, the records of which shall be open for public examination for the information of the public whereby the names of debenture holders and the names of assessable income taxpayers shall be known as well as any other matter in connection with the public service shall be as accessible to the public as a search now made in the Registry office of the province.

The nominating committee, through their chairman, Mr. Thomas Doyle, here presented their report, recommending that Mr. J. T. Mellish, be the candidate for Councilman and Mr. Ephram Gallant, of Rustico, the candidate for Assemblyman.

On motion of Mr. A. C. Shaw, seconded by Mr. Harris, the report was unanimously ratified.

Mr. Wise, Mr. John Smith and

Mr. M. Berrigan were appointed a committee to wait on Mr. Mellish and Mr. Gallant and convey to them the fact of their nomination.

While this was being done Dr. Macneill addressed the meeting.

The nomination was then accepted by Messrs. Mellish and Gallant, both of whom addressed the meeting. They promised a thoroughly clean campaign, and also spoke in reference to the financial position of the province.

The meeting closed with rousing cheers for the candidates and the Queen.

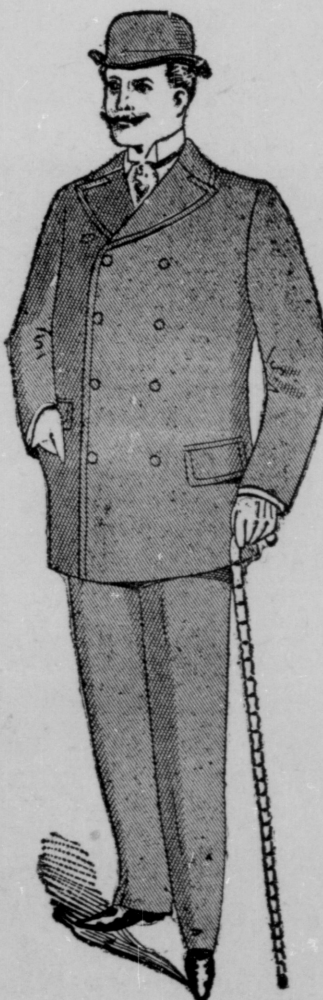
