Canadian Dollar Moves Up Again

BUFFALO, N. Y., Nov. 14 (AP)—The premium on the Canadian dollar in Buffalo banks jumped back to one per cent today after touching one-half per cent yesterday, the lowest buying rate in months.

The selling rate, two per cent yesterday, rose to 2 1/2 per cent today. Yesterday's buying rate was a full percentage point lower than on Wednesday.

Inquest Held In Death Of Commercial Cross Mar

A coroner's jury last evening found that Basil Beaton, Commercial Cross, came to his death on October 29th, by being jammed between the door and the body of the car when the door came in contact with a tree, while he was driving as a passenger in a car owned and driven by John K. MacDonald. The inquest was held at the Legion Hall, Montague, before Coroner Dr. G. S. A. Inman. Representing the crown were Mr. J. O. C. Campbell, deputy attorney general, and Mr. S. S. Hessian, Q.C. Mr. Somerled Trainor appeared for the defense.

The post office building at Hopefield, owned by Mr. Chester MacEachern, was destroyed by fire Thursday evening. The post office occupied one room in a dwelling which was moved to the site and almost completely remodelled recently. Origin of the outbreak was believed from a defective flue. So far as could be learned there was no insurance on the two-story building. No mail was lost, it was reported, but some money orders were destroyed. The dwelling house portion of the building was occupied.

Preston Beaton of Brooklyn, the next witness, said that he had been a passenger in the car. He said he had been at Cardigan in the morning, and later met Billy MacPherson on the road, and they had had a drink. They went to see John K. MacDonald, and he gave MacDonald a drink. He and MacPherson then drove to Gordon MacDonald's home, and the three then drove back to MacPherson's home.

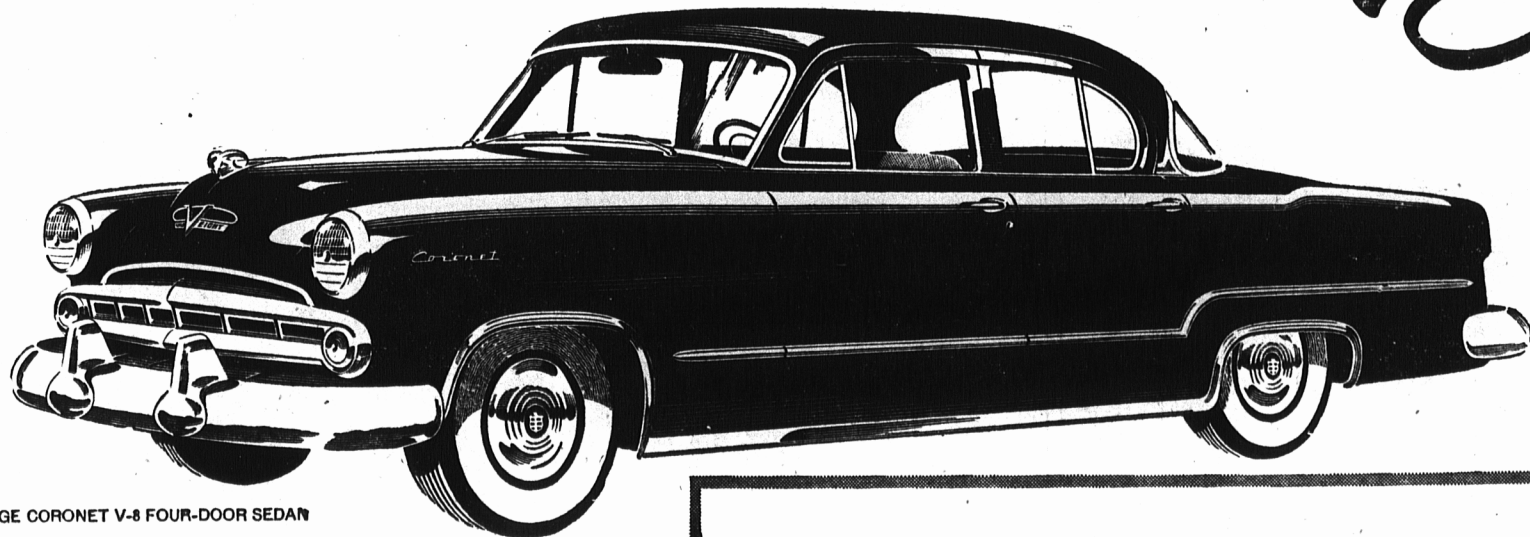

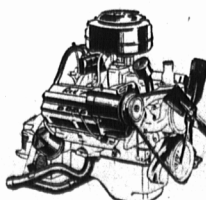
