

The annual vacation school at Trinity United Church, Charlottetown was brought to a close Friday morning completing a successful week of activities. A total of 210 pupils and 22 teachers and assistants were enrolled in three departments, beginners (ages six to 12), primary (4-12) and junior (9-12).

The beginners department was under the supervision of Mrs. Raulston Johnston, with 78 enrolled. Other leaders were: Mrs. Blair Grove MacMillan, Covehead Road was fined \$10 and costs for driving with more than three adults in the front seat.

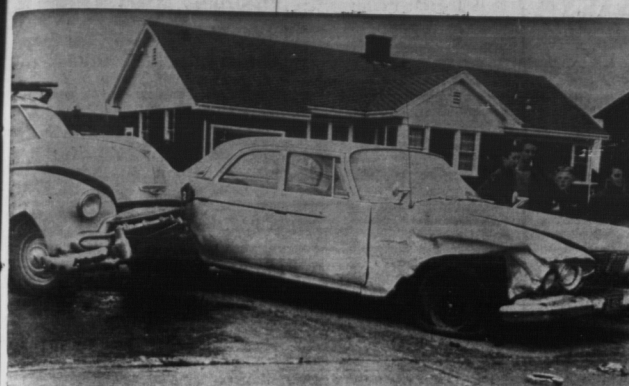

Potato Bd. Regulations Found Not Applicable

Following a trial which has extended over a period of several weeks, a charge under the P.E.I. Potato Marketing Board Regulations, was dismissed against Sterling Hackett, Mt. Allison, by Magistrate James B. Johnston, Q.C. in Queens County Magistrate's court yesterday afternoon.

Hackett, who was counselled by Allison M. Gillis was charged with trucking potatoes to the mainland through Wood Islands, without the potatoes being properly invoiced and without paying the one-cent per hundred weight levy as required by the board. The case for the prosecution was conducted by John J. Holmes.
