**Successful Track, Field  
Meet At S'side Airport**

**Ducks Unlimited  
To Make Financial  
Assistance Available**

Financial assistance to the extent of \$3,000 will be made available by Ducks Unlimited (Canada) for a project at Fullerton's Marsh, five miles from Charlotteville, aimed at improving conditions for waterfowl. This will be the first time such a development has been undertaken in Prince Edward Island by the organization of sportsmen.

Most of the money will be spent to block the outlets from the marsh under the highway bridge at the north end. This would be done to establish a permanent minimum water level which will be exceeded during high tides.

Blocking of the outlets will flood the whole area of the marsh for several hundred yards away from the bridge and beyond a railway trestle at the far end. The result will be a large pond which will provide an ideal resting and feeding place for migratory waterfowl. Interest of Ducks Unlimited in the project is confined to the possibilities for improvement of waterfowl conditions. The marsh will not be a sanctuary but merely a place to give the birds an opportunity to rest during flights.

Trout in Fullerton's Marsh will also benefit from the plans, according to J. A. Rodd, Provincial Director of Fisheries. He has examined the area at high and low tides and says two inlets, Forbes and McCallum's brooks, will provide excellent spawning grounds for adults as well as nurseries for fry and smaller trout.

On the basis of his survey, Mr. Rodd is also convinced that marginal and tide flat springs will supply fresh water habitats for trout at high tide should they prefer them to salt water. A permanent water level would also help conditions for muskrat.

Ducks Unlimited had a biological survey of the marsh made last April. The survey was favorable and they went ahead with plans to spend \$3,000 on the development. This will be forthcoming as soon as the Provincial Department of Public Works draws up its plans and these are approved by Ducks Unlimited.

The Department will do the job because of the fact the outlets will be under the main highway bridge on the road to Mt. Herbert.

The Canadian National Railway have had their engineers examine the railway trestle and roadbed which runs through the far end of the marsh and have no objection to the proposed project.

Pep, looking once more the old will of the wisp, blazed through four fast rounds at Hartford, Conn. The little, 28-year-old champ moved in and out on sparmites Ray Caetillo and Johnny Carr, sticking with his left and crossing snappy rights.

Through most of the 20 days of his earlier training, Pep concentrated more on punching than on speed. But today it was elusive Willie on the bicycle, banging away and then getting away from the intended counters.

At Summit, N.J., the hard-hitting, 24-year-old Saddler banged away with his left in four rounds with Wilbur Jefferson and Massimo Sanna.

**Tuna Tournament  
Opens Next Week**

WEDGEPORT, N.S., Sept. 6—(CP)—Fishermen of five languages will cuss and coax the fight-est fish to surface a fin as they put out to sea from this village on Nova Scotia's west coast next week to compete in the seventh International Tuna Cup matches.

Luring the bluefins which have a preference for the shallow, fast-flowing waters off the coast will be such men as Capt. Cyril Frisby of Guildford, England, who won the coveted Victoria Cross during the First World War. He will captain the Commonwealth team, which will include anglers from Bermuda, South Africa, Australia and Canada.

Seven teams will compete in the match which runs from Sept. 13-16. Chile is entering for the first time, while Cuba, Brazil, Argentina and a combined team from Denmark and Sweden will also wet lines in the swift waters of soldier's rip, 12 miles from shore.

But the team to watch is the United States aggregation headed by George Thomas of Los Angeles, Calif. The Americans copped the Alton B. Trophy in 1948 and again last year.

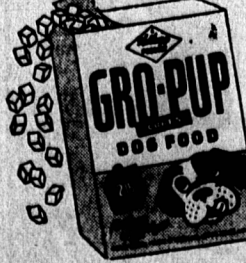
