

Lake Level Study Urged Immediately

TORONTO (CP)—Officials of two Canadian provinces and eight American states affected by fluctuating levels of the Great Lakes have decided to call on their federal governments to launch immediately a "special and comprehensive" study of the problem.

The Canadian and United States governments will be asked to have the study of the whole area of water management undertaken by the International Joint Commission, which has jurisdiction over border waters.

The one-day conference, called by the Ontario government because of the current acute concerns over low water levels, also indicated it will meet again at some later date to hear a report on what progress is being made on the situation.

A statement issued after the meeting said the two provinces involved—Ontario and Quebec—offered to cooperate fully with the Great Lakes commission, made up of representatives of the eight lake-bordering states in attendance at the meeting.

Premier John Robarts of Ontario told reporters after the closed sessions that his province, meanwhile, intends to go ahead with an earlier decision of its own to study the effects of water levels in Ontario, both on the Great Lakes and other waters.

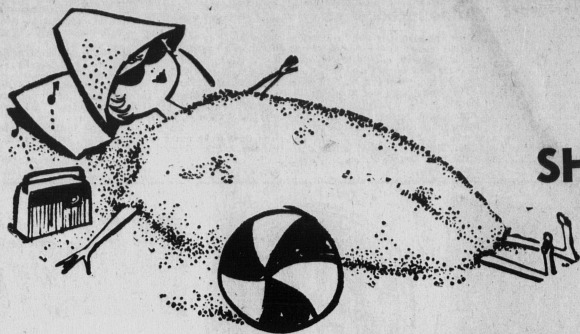

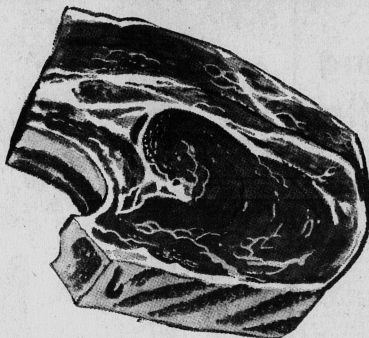
