**Miss Stewart Reaches Semi-Finals In Golf**

BRIGHTWOOD, N. S. (CP) — Marlene Stewart drove into the semi-finals of the Canadian women's open golf championship Thursday but the third round upset of two-time titlist Grace Lenzyk stole the spotlight from the Ponthill, Ont., star.

Marlene, who won the 1954 close championship only last week brought the open title within sight by routing sparkling par golf on the first 13 holes to eliminate Rae Milligan of Jasper, Alta., 7 and 5. Miss Lenzyk, of Newington,

Conn., fell before long-driving Barbara Bruning of Armonk, N. Y., who grabbed a four-up lead on the first nine. The pretty 22-year-old Long Island native swept the quarter-final match 4 and 3 on the 15th hole.

Smooth - stroking Mrs. Maurice Glick of Baltimore, Md., defeated Ruth Wilson of Vancouver 1 up after doing the first nine with a medal score of 42, four over par.

The fourth match of the day saw Mary Gay of Kitchener, Ont., finally take the measure of Victoria's surprising junior, Shirley Fry, 1 up on the 19th.

The girls halved the 17th and Mary forced the playoff when she sank a beautiful 10-foot iron shot. Shirley led by one stroke at the second before, with the pressure at blow-off point, Shirley put too much on the ball and it skirted the edge of the cup eight feet away and kept rolling.

Shirley wound up in the rough on the 19th and her chip shot carried clear across the green. Miss Gay's ball lay only inches from the cup and Shirley conceded with a rueful grin.

Marlene will tee off today in the semi-final against Mrs. Glick who finished Monday's qualifying round with a 79—only one stroke off the 78 carded by Marlene and Mary Gay.

The other match pits Barbara Bruning against Miss Gay.

**Balkan Pact Signed Last Week For Royal Yacht Not Collective Action Against Aggression Open To Visitors**

BLED, Yugoslavia (AP) — Communist Yugoslavia linked herself indirectly to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization Monday by signing a 20-year military alliance with Greece and Turkey for collective action against aggression.

Marshal Tito's government, which before its ouster from Moscow's Cominform six years ago was aiding a pro-Kremlin rebellion in Greece, bound itself in the historic new pact to stand with the Greeks and Turks against the threat of aggression from Russia or her Balkan partners.

Foreign minister Koca Popovic of Yugoslavia, Stephen Stephanopoulos of Greece and Fuad Korpulu of Turkey signed the alliance in a village in this resort town which is Tito's summer diplomatic capital. The agreement was hailed abroad as a contribution to defence of the free world.

**TWO NATO MEMBERS**

Greece and Turkey are NATO members. Yugoslavia is not. But by signing the new pact, Tito's regime agrees to join Greece and Turkey in determining what action should be taken if any NATO member is attacked.

This article of the pact does not commit Yugoslavia to direct participation with armed forces but it clearly brings Yugoslavia more closely into collaboration with the Western orbit in the cold war.

The three partners agree to collective defence if any one of them

is attacked, and to peacetime collaboration to perfect their defences.

Military observers said the alliance terms probably will result in more advantageous strategy planning and open the way for freer exchange of military information among the three.

**1,000,000-MAN ALLIANCE**

The armed forces of the three countries together may total more than 1,000,000 men. Turkey has a standing army of 450,000; Greece has more than 125,000, and while there are no official figures on Tito's forces, he is believed to have about 600,000 men under arms.

The new agreement expands a Balkan friendship treaty signed by Greece, Turkey and Yugoslavia in 1953. The military pact was to

**FLIGHTS BANNED**

CALCUTTA, India, (Reuters) — India has banned airplane flights over the strategic northeast frontier area for two years, except with permission of the governor of Assam.

Montreal, (CP) — The Royal yacht, Britannia, lies aloof in Montreal harbor for thousands of persons to see and none to touch.

The Britannia, which arrived here Saturday on a courtesy visit, will pick up the Duke of Edinburgh at Goose Bay, Labrador, where his tour of Canada ends Aug. 17. She sails for Quebec

**Pilgrimage To Rome Organized**

CAP DE LA MADELEINE, Que. (CP) — A Canadian pilgrimage to Rome for the International Marian Congress starting Oct. 24 is being organized by officials of the National Marian Congress now in session here. It was announced Wednesday.

Rev. H. Charbonneau of the Notre Dame du Cap shrine is in charge of organizing the pilgrimage, intended to show the Canadian Roman Catholic's devotion to the Blessed Virgin and to convey to the International Congress the well-wishes and resolutions of the National Congress.

The pilgrims will leave New York Oct. 9 aboard the Italian liner Conte Lian Camano and will return Nov. 26.

They are scheduled to stop at Lisbon, Portugal for a one-day visit to the Marian shrine at Fatima, and at Madrid, Spain for tours of the shrines at Pilar and Montserrat.

After the International Congress the pilgrims will visit Marian shrines in France, including the world-famous fountain of Lourdes.
