For Business Men

Advertising in Africa.

The African Export Gazette says: Now, everybody who has made advertising a study knows that the returns which cannot be traced, and the indirect benefits secured from advertising are of more importance than the traceable results. The business man who will not advertise because he fears he won't get value received is like the man who won't insure his property or his life on the theory that if his property does not burn or he does not die, he will lose the premiums paid. The business man is after trade. He knows that an article that is advertised and known is easier to sell than something unknown. He advertises to obtain publicity for his house and wares, and to state his claims for patronage. If the profit on sales from an advertisement do not pay for it, he knows that the advertisement has helped to popularise his goods, and that sales through travelling men and dealers are made easier, increased by his advertising. He also knows that if goods meet what he claims, which induce individuals and dealers to buy, that every first order influenced by advertisement will result in a permanent customer. This is the way the shrewd advertiser figures. He knows that results are sure to follow, and the placing of his advertising is given as much attention and study as that of selection of stock, employing competent help, or any other department of his business.

Ruts.

The people have fixed ideas, notions likes and dislikes. You ask them once to do something new, to try some new thing, and they pay no attention. Admiral Farragut was a brainy and nerry officer, and yet if he had had his way we would be to-day fighting Spain with wooden ships. Dynamite guns have been a success for years, but it was the middle of May, 1898, before a dynamite gun was ever used in actual warfare. This merely shows that people are hard to move out of their beaten paths. And the fact that they are hard to move is another argument in favor of advertising. When they have moved out of their rut and begun using your goods they are in another rut, and the next man who tries to bring them over to his goods has as hard a time as you had; and if he is an early quitter, you retain this trade perhaps for years after the advertisement that brought it to you has been forgotten.—The Billboard.

When you wish to write a good ad—one that will convince buyers that your store is loaded with bargains—just tell your story in a matter of fact way, use plenty of common sense, and be sure to tell the truth.—Up to Date Ideas.

Advertising a Study.

Many business men give to little attention to the preparation of the advertisement. Men who are particular to employ the best salesmen to represent them will get up most common place advertisements and place them in the papers that either do not reach their trade or have no prestige. An advertisement, to a certain extent, answers the same purpose as a salesman. It should set forth to the dealer or consumer the merits of the article advertised. It should be attractive and forcible, just as a salesman should be able to gain the attention of a customer. It is a waste of money to pay high

rates for advertising and then not prepare the ads that will be most effective. It is like paying high prices for material and then not putting it properly together or buying a stock of goods and then not trying to dispose of them.—St Louis (Mo.) Farm Machinery.

Good advertising can not be called an expense, for it is only an investment just as you place your money in a glove stock, or a line of furnishings, and you get your money out of just as surely, and with possibly a better margin on the investment.—Advertising World.
