 2 cups diced cooked chicken
 1 1/2 cups chicken bouillon additional
 4 drops Tabasco
 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
 2 tablespoons cornstarch
 3/4 cup cold water additional
 1 cup cooked green lima or shelled green beans
 2 diced skinned large tomatoes
 6 diced medium scallops
 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
 2 cups long grain rice (cook separately, as usual)
 In oil, steam - saute onions, celery, carrots and mushrooms 3 minutes.
 Add bouillon; simmer-cook 30 minutes.
