He related his surprise and pleasure when he learned of his good fortune on the 10th, which incidentally was their twelfth wedding anniversary, to hear his name blared out over the air that he had won the World's Championship with his potato sample. Export Christmas Trees From The Montague Area

The Christmas tree exportation industry is about ready for another season, which although of only three weeks duration, involves hundreds of thousands of dollars across the Dominion as Christmas trees are moved by car load lots and trucks to the American market.

A portion is exported annually from this Province, and during the past week activity has been stepped up as the date of shipments near. In Montague two trucks loads, carrying over 2,000 trees, will leave for Boston at the end of this week. Mr. Cecil Bell, who is exporting the trees, feels that there is a ready market in Boston, and little difficulty is anticipated in disposing of the trees. Mr. Wilfred Watterworth will leave early next week with two truck loads for Washington, D. C., taking approximately 1,000 trees. Mr. Watterworth is also of the opinion that a ready market in that city will be available.
