## Trans-Canada Motorcade's Tour Is Described By MLA

Just one month after leaving Newfoundland on a cross-country trek, Trans-Canada motorcade cars dipped their wheels in the Pacific at Victoria, B.C. The journey across Canada was made by representatives from each Canadian province to mark the completion of the Trans-Canada Highway.

Frank Myers, Queens MLA, represented Prince Edward Island in the motorcade, and at Rogers Pass, B. C., where Prime Minister Diefenbaker declared the highway officially open, he unveiled a plaque for this province to commemorate the event.

Mr. Diefenbaker unveiled the main plaque, and following this donned the yellow helmet of a road worker and used the motorcade's tour of the province included such places as New Westminster, Queen Elizabeth Park, the Suspension Bridge, Cleveland Dam, Grosse Pointe, Butchart Gardens, and the Royal London Wax Museum in Victoria.

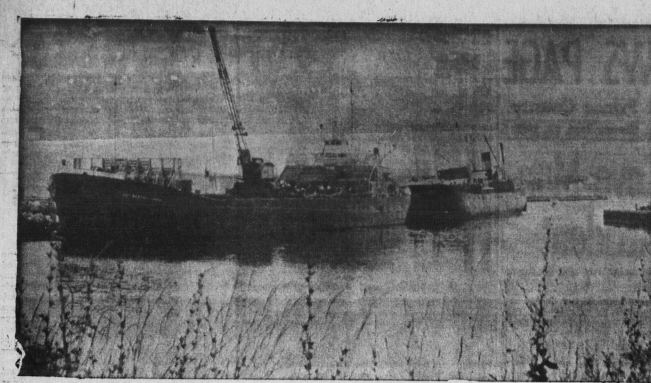

## Potato Marketing Will Be Explained By Gangster

By NEIL A. MATHESON Provincial and Farm Editor Prince Edward Island Farmers' Association will be explaining the potato marketing program to growers in a public place and three others were each fined \$20 for having liquor in place other than their residence.

The marketing director emphasized the peril price cutting by shippers here, but added that the farmer must be the best part of responsibility if they sell at too low a price. A letter to the farmer he said, potato broker revealed that the farmers in Shelburne and Allison counties, (Ontario) for example, have reached an agreement not to sell their spuds under \$1.33 per cwt. as the food terminal.

Mr. Markstrom stressed the market is strengthening in Ontario, and shippers should not quote a price less than \$1.90 a bag landed in Toronto, and that should mean \$1.10 to \$1.20 here, in the farmer he said.

"There has been one dealer in Toronto," he said, "who has been saying he can buy P.E.I. potatoes for \$1.45, but this is distasteful to the reputable Ontario buyer, as well as harmful to the industry."
