BRITISH VS. BOERS!

The Boers went into the fight possessing every advantage. Armed to the teeth, with every modern invention pertaining to warfare, admirably led, stubborn, courageous, in point of numbers between two and three to one, and every man familiar with the ground upon which he fought; the British unready, their commanding general and two-thirds of his forces in Great Britain to be transported upwards of six thousand miles, the conditions such that they cannot use the strongest arm of their service—the navy,—in the position of a boxer who steps into a strange and unknown ring with one hand bound to his side! Yet the British have held their own all along the line and won victories in the face of heavy odds; have transported the bulk of their army without a hitch; have organized three distinct campaigns all of which are now in successful progress. Surely the British have, within the past six weeks, performed the greatest military feat of history!

At the beginning, the Boers were confident that they would be able to crush the small force in Natal, long before reinforcements could arrive. The London Times, correspondent at Cape Town states that they intended to have issued their ultimatum on the first or second of October and to have entered Natal at once. But some details of organization, in respect particularly to the commissariat, induced them to postpone active operations for ten days. When, upon the 11th of October, they invaded Natal, they were fully prepared for action. They chose their own time, and they hoped that Natal and Cape Colony would be in their possession, and there Dutch inhabitants commandeered, before succor from Great Britain would arrive. But they counted without the splendid discipline and courage of the British a Ladysmith, Kimberley and Mafeking.

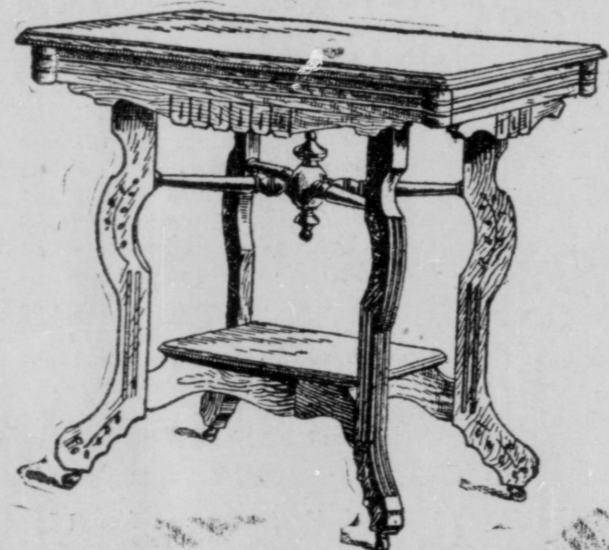
POINTS FOR THE GUARDIAN.

If, as The Guardian now admits, the prohibition proposed by the Dominion Alliance is not prohibition of the importation of liquors—an essential condition, in the opinion of every intelligent person here—surely it is incumbent upon its promoters to frankly say so at the meetings, and not go on using the word as though it implied all that the people suppose.

Even if it were necessary to pass an Act of the Dominion Parliament in order that Charlottetown may get rid of the License law fastened upon it by Premier Farquharson and his party, still it is not necessary to conceal the important and essential fact from those who are asked to sign the pledge.

But the passage of such an act is not at all necessary to this end: for by defeating the government candidates in Belfast and Murray Harbor, the Farquharson Administration will be ousted, and the repeal of the obnoxious act will follow.

May we ask why Mr. Marshall was not sent to Belfast and Murray Harbor to call upon the temperance electors to "vote them down," rather than to other parts of the Province to promote a prohibition which will not prohibit?

Business in the village continues brisk, with lots of oats, pork, etc, moving to market. Several large shipments of pork have already been sent to the maritime markets. The coasting vessels are engaged carrying produce to the markets across the gulf and bringing coal and other merchandise to this port for the merchants. Prominent among the hustlers are Captains McKinnon, Hyde and Dunn.

The cheese factory closed its season's cheese-making early in October, and is now busy making butter, for which, owing to the excellent quality of the butter manufactured, the demand is great. This season's output of cheese exceeded that of last year, and the patrons have received good returns for the milk supplied. The excellent quality of the butter and cheese manufactured and the general management in connection therewith is very creditable to the manufacturers, whose names are by words with ever consumer of their cheese and butter in this place—if not in England.

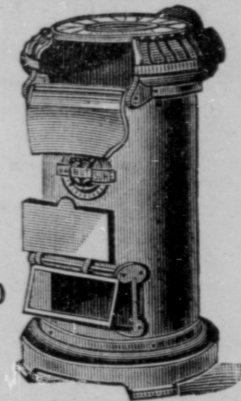

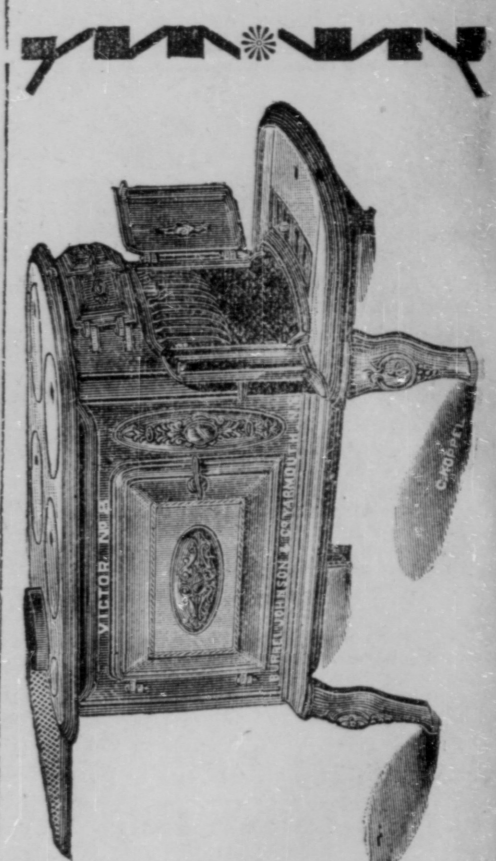
