It was next to impossible to predict how Sylvia's mind would work in a given situation. Her approach to the game was so different from what ordinary mortals would regard as a rational one that some of the results she achieved were simply fantastic. True it is that many times she got herself (and partner) into hot water as a result of her adventurous spirit. Not that Sylvia ever intended to depart from what she thought was the right bid or play. It was only that some of the things she regarded as completely logical and perfectly normal were considered by friend and foe alike as, let us say, queer. Here is an example of what happened one day at the club. Sylvia held the East hand. You would think from looking at all hands that South would make four spades with a diamond lead. And no doubt he would have except that he was playing against a spade to the jack and another spade back, taken with the ace. A diamond was returned and ruffed. Declarer then led the nine of hearts, and played low from dummy, whereupon Sylvia took the trick with the ace! This extraordinary play, when she could have won the trick with the queen, was typical of Sylvia's thinking. Maybe she figured the queen would win later, and what order the tricks were taken. Sylvia returned a club. South naturally assumed West had the queen of hearts, so he went up with the ace of clubs and repeated the heart finesse, intending to discard his clubs on dummy's hearts. But when he played the jack from dummy, Sylvia, much to his amazement, won with the queen, cashed the king of clubs, and the contract went down one. Had Sylvia won the first heart lead with the queen, South undoubtedly would have taken the club finesse and made the contract. But Sylvia had lulled him into a false sense of security.

Wilson Will See Governor, May Escape Electric Chair

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP)—Jimmy Wilson was brought here Tuesday for a face-to-face meeting with Governor James E. Folsom who's reported ready to save him from the electric chair. But the 55-year-old Negro under death sentence for robbing an elderly white widow of \$1,055 didn't get to see Governor Folsom Tuesday night. The governor, recovering in a hospital from a minor illness, said he will delay the interview until his legal adviser, E. C. Boswell, returns from New Orleans, probably Thursday. Folsom, under treatment for a minor illness, ordered the man brought to his hospital room from Atmore Prison Farm. SAVING ACTION? The governor declined to say what action he will take, but reliable sources predicted that he will save Wilson from the electric chair where he is to die Oct. 24. Wilson was sentenced to death when convicted of robbing an 82-year-old white widow at her home in Marion, Ala., July 27, 1957. Under Alabama law robbery, a capital offence, is defined as the taking of money or other goods of value from another person by force or threat of violence, regardless of the amount involved.

August Export Figures Given

OTTAWA (CP)—Exports in August declined five per cent from the corresponding month last year but were almost unchanged in the January-August period. The bureau of statistics said Tuesday August exports eased to \$416,000,000 from \$437,400,000 a year ago. They totalled \$3,216,900,000 in the eight months, up from \$3,217,100,000 in 1957. Sales to the United States and Britain declined in August but rose to other Commonwealth and foreign countries. In the eight months exports to the U.S. and other foreign countries dropped but rose to Britain and other Commonwealth countries. Exports to the U.S. in August declined to \$240,700,000 from \$276,300,000 last year. In the January-August period they dropped to \$1,859,200,000 from \$1,922,900,000.

Find Cancer Substance In Baked Starch

MELBOURNE, Australia (Reuters)—Research scientists at Melbourne University have found a cancer-producing substance in heated starchy foods, it was announced Tuesday. Sir Peter McCullam, chairman of the executive committee of the Victorian Anti-Cancer Council, told the annual meeting that starch in potatoes, bread, pastry or similar foods roasted or baked in an ordinary home oven could produce this substance, known as three-four benzopyrene. The amount was minute, but there was a certain degree of risk, he added. HEARING POSTPONED NEW GLASGOW (CP)—The preliminary hearing Monday of Gordon Rice of Stellarton, N. S., charged with murder in the Sept. 14 rifle slaying of William Joseph White, was postponed a week. White's body was found in Rice's home.
