THE PREMIERSHIP.

While congratulating Judge Warburton, we must not forget to condescend to the Liberal Party which has now on its hands the invidious task of selecting a new Leader. It was understood by prominent Liberals, no later than yesterday, that a meeting of the party in the Legislature would be held for this purpose. But seeing that the party organs—both the Patriot and the Guardian—are outspokenly favorable to the Hon. D. Farquharson, we conclude that the selection has, de facto, been already made and that the meeting will be merely pro forma. Mr. Farquharson has at least one characteristic of a leader of the Liberal party—he has shown that he has a proper idea of the importance of number one. If the interests of the Province go with those of Mr. Farquharson in the party leadership, so much the better for the Province. Mr. Farquharson has undoubted claims upon the Liberal Party. He upheld it during all the years of Opposition. He fought for commercial union, unrestricted reciprocity, abolition of protection—every tad and fancy of his leaders both in this Province and in the Dominion at large; and with his party he has proved false to almost every principle and proposition that he maintained while in opposition. If standing by the party and partaking of the party plunder, and swallowing political principles for the sake of the party, constitute claims and ability for leadership, Mr. Farquharson is eminently qualified and ought to be forthwith elected Leader of the Liberal Party in this Province. But we imagine that his Leadership will be beset with a few difficulties. In the first place his colleague, Mr. Wise, desires to be made Commissioner of Public Works and will have to be reckoned with and "made right." Mr. James R. McLean, too, will doubtless claim a reversion of the Public Works Commissioner, and whether satisfied or dissatisfied will certainly prove a thorn in the side of the Farquharson Administration. No doubt Mr. Farquharson will have the Public Works Department administered upon temperance principles. After disposing of Messrs. Wise and McLean, Mr. Farquharson will have to deal with Hon. Benjamin Rogers, of this city. Mr. Rogers' name has been at the head of the list of those whom Dame Rumor has lately mentioned for the Premiership. His pretensions may, perhaps, be satisfied by a word (of the right kind) from Sir Louis Davies; but the new Leader will have difficulty in persuading Sir Louis to say the word. Altogether Mr. Farquharson will, if elected, have abundant opportunity for the exertion of his powers of finance, his ability as a financier and administrator, and his undoubted genius for taking care of his favorite number. This latter power has, indeed, been acquired by all the Liberal leaders, from Sir Oliver Mowat to Messrs. Lister and Choquette. Our Liberal gentlemen obtain a place in Parliament, often by dint of bribery and corruption; then they proceed to feather their own nests. The people elect them to serve the country and they hasten to serve themselves. This is all wrong. But we must not blame Mr. Farquharson too severely if he should prove to be an apt exemplar of this fundamental Liberal principle.

Halifax Herald: Mr. Foster's estimate for expenditure on consolidated revenue account and on capital account combined, for the year 1896-97 was, in round numbers, \$41,200,000. Election of District Chairmen.

WELCOME TO REV. MR. WADMAN

MONDAY, June 27.

At the forenoon session, the Sunday School report, submitted, by Rev. G. M. Young, was adopted.

Dr. Sprague submitted a resolution respecting a reduction in the price of Methodist Hymn Books, which was warmly endorsed by Rev. S. E. Huestis, of Halifax.

A motion was adopted providing for a committee to consolidate the conference funds.

A motion that one layman and one Minister be elected to represent each district on the Stationary Committee, also carried.

At the afternoon session the name of the Miramichi District was changed to the Chatham District.

Rev. H. Harrison presented the Report of the Young People's Societies which was considered section by section.

A report of the Committee on Evangelistic work was presented by ex-president Weddall, and Mr. Bond introduced matters in connection with the Wesleyan.

Rev. Geo. Steele then delivered the lectures given by him at the Sackville closing, the subject of which was "Man perfected in Jesus Christ." The lecture was excellent in every particular.

Dr. Stewart occupied the chair at the sustentation meeting in the evening. The report, which was read by Rev. John Goldsmith, showed that the following amounts had been raised:

Wadman returned in person from Japan who arrived in the city last night. Mr. Wadman was in the Conference during the morning session. The pastor of the Church called the attention of the Conference to the fact, and the reverent gentleman was at once called to the platform, and welcomed by the President. Mr. Wadman delivered a very pleasing address. He looks well after a sojourn of nine years in Japan, and if the address he delivered be a fair test, we should judge that he has lost none of his old time eloquence. We hope to have many opportunities of hearing him before his return to the East.

The Rev. Benjamin Chappell was also called to the platform and briefly addressed the conference.

The order of the day was called, namely, the reading of the station sheet.
