

# NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

Special dispatch to Examiner.

**LONDON, Jan. 20.**  
A despatch to Rome from the *Pull Mall Gazette* says that the people are surprised and indignant at Cardinal McCloskey's reception of Parnell in New York, and has ordered Cardinal Nina, Papal Secretary of State, to telegraph Cardinal McCloskey for information on the subject.

The Pope is indisposed and confined to his bed.  
Julius Favre died last night at Versailles, aged 71.

**MADRID, Jan. 20.**  
Senor Toreno, Minister of Foreign Affairs, will be nominated as President of the Deputies to-morrow.

Premier Castillo provisionally administered the Minister of Foreign Affairs.

**DUBLIN, Jan. 20.**  
A meeting of 33 home rulers members of Parliament to-day, under the presidency of the Lord Mayor, passed resolutions calling upon the Government to institute a reproductive relief work.

William Shaw said that the Government will fully shut its eyes to the distress in Ireland.

Mitchell Henry said if their demands were not complied with, they must force acceptance by constitutional action or otherwise.

Daniel O'Donoghue announced that he would in future act with the Home Rulers. The Irish Land League has resolved to hold a great meeting in Phoenix Park, in furtherance of land movements, on February 22nd.

Verr Foster, of Belfast, has addressed a letter to Mr. Parnell, which is published in the "Belfast Northern Whig." Foster offers to donate 15,000 pounds to assist emigration from Donegal, Clare, Kerry, Cork and Connaught, to Canada and the Western States of America.

**OTTAWA, Jan. 20.**  
The *Toronto Mail* vigorously condemns the dismissal by the Government of those officers of the 10th Royals, who were dismissed because the gave evidence favorable to the *Globe* in a recent libel suit by Col. Strallery. At Cornwall to-day, Bergen, Conservative, and McLellan, Opposition, were nominated for the Commis. Dr. Tupper spoke in favor of Bergen.

## Supreme Court.

**JANUARY 21.**  
The Queen vs. William McKinnon and others. William McKinnon, Michael Burns and Edward O'Neill were last evening arraigned for breaking into Beer & Sons store, and severally pleaded not guilty. Their trial was set down for Thursday. Mr. A. B. Warburton is retained to defend McKinnon.

Mitchell vs. Bowers. The Court is still occupied with Mitchell's suit against Bowers. Messrs. William C. DesBrisay, William Lochhead and Richard Hartz were examined as experts, and all swore they believed the signature to the note in question was genuine. No little amusement was caused in Court by two of these gentlemen stating that they did not think some signatures which were admitted to be genuine, were the defendant's signature; the most they would say was that the "P" and the "R" were something like his writing. The case will, probably, not be concluded until to-morrow.

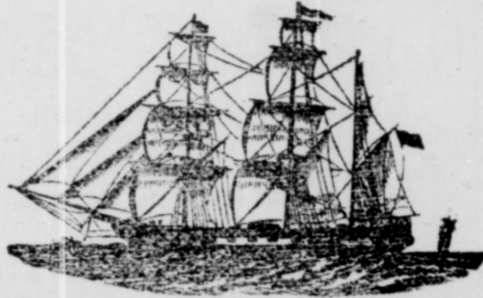
