

CANADA.—There seems to be some foundation for the rumor for Sir Charles Metcalfe's resignation, though late Kingston papers do not mention it; the Toronto Colonist of the 21th says:—

"The report gains ground that Sir C. Metcalfe has resigned the high post of Governor General, and that his Excellency, on account of ill health, is anxious to return to England, with as little delay as possible—so soon as a successor is appointed."

There has been another row between the Corkonians and Connaughtians, on the Welland Canal, Canada. One man was killed, and several severely injured.

TEXAS.—It is stated by a correspondent of the Journal of Commerce, that the President will, in his next annual Message, recommend the annexation of Texas to the United States! !

What will brother Jonathan say to this?—
"The British Government has presented claims of its subjects, to land in Texas, amounting to from ten to twenty millions of acres! They are principally Empresario Grants. These demands will probably cover nearly all the public domain West of the Colorado river; and the government of Texas has been notified by Capt Elliott, in accordance with the instructions he has received, that unless the facts set forth by these claimants are refuted, or a satisfactory explanation given, her Majesty's Government would feel fully authorised to take the necessary steps to enforce the just claims of those of her liege subjects."

CHINA.—Advices from China are to the beginning of August, which are of much interest and importance. The new tariff of duties on the foreign trade, and the general regulations under which the trade is in further to be carried on, have at length been fully arranged and completed. Both of these documents have been generally considered satisfactory.—The tariff is simple and reasonable, and its advantages, so far as we can perceive, are rather more in favour of the trader than in favour of the Chinese.

Tuesday night's Gazette contains a copy of the treaty between her Majesty and Emperor of China, signed at Nanking, August 29, 1843, and the declaration respecting transit duties.

It is rumoured in the Bombay, Gentlemen's Gazette, September 29th, that a rumor is current in well informed quarters that Colonel Stoddart, whose death has been long believed, is yet alive.
