

CLC To Take Firmer Stand, Jodoin Says

OTTAWA (CP) — The Canadian Labor Congress will press for a "more realistic approach" to labor and economic matters in Canada in 1966, CLC President Claude Jodoin said in a New Year's statement issued Monday.

These matters would be raised when the Congress meets the federal government early in 1966.

"We will also seek increased activity on the part of the Economic Council of Canada so that all sections of our society may play their future role in the type of planning that is so badly needed."

The CLC would continue to seek improvements in social security and other forms of legislation, with top priority being given to a truly comprehensive health insurance program.

The employment situation in Canada had improved noticeably, particularly in the latter part of the year, Mr. Jodoin said.

But the air of uncertainty and the knowledge that an unprecedented number of young people are about to enter the labor force, make it quite clear that present conditions carry no automatic assurance for the future.

Rivard Moved To Federal Pen

ATLANTA, Ga. (CP) — Lucien Rivard, 30, of Montreal, serving a 20-year prison term after being convicted as a key figure in an international heroin-smuggling operation, has been transferred from Texas to the federal penitentiary here, it was learned Monday.

A penitentiary spokesman said Rivard was transferred to the prison Dec. 8 after having been found guilty in Laredo, Tex., Nov. 12. He also was fined \$20,000.

Rivard was brought to trial after his recapture following an escape from Montreal's Bordeaux jail last spring. He had been held by Canadian authorities at the time pending extradition proceedings.

Prairie Town Seeks Plant

NIPAWIN, Sask. (CP) — This community Monday joined three Alberta centres seeking a heavy water plant to be built for Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd. Percy Watson, Nipawin mayor and Lloyd Jackson, president of the chamber of commerce, in a joint telegram asked that Nipawin be considered as site for the plant because of its location on the banks of the Saskatchewan River and at the headwaters of Tobin Lake.

Nipawin is 85 miles east of Prince Albert.

Atomic Energy was forced to reconsider tenders on the project after Dynamic Power of Calgary failed to meet its deadline to build the plant at Estevan, Sask.

Three Alberta communities — Lac la Biche, Cold Lake and Peace River — also have requested consideration.

Wider Choices In Red Schools

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet schools will offer more choice in subjects and will increasingly divide smart students from slow learners, a commission report said Monday.

The new school program prepared by the Commission of Scientists and Educationists will reduce the compulsory part of studies and offer optional courses in natural and mathematical sciences or in humanities and art.

Some students will get vocational training. But increasingly the gifted ones will receive special attention.

"It is planned to have some schools with special emphasis on physics, chemistry, mathematics, biology, radio engineering, and mechanization and electrification of agriculture," the news agency Tass said in a summary of the commission report.

"Such schools will be given improved facilities and more teachers."
