Energy Board Bill Changed Slightly

OTTAWA (CP)—The government's National Energy Board bill moved slowly but steadily ahead in the Commons Monday with a few slight changes being made.

A section on board powers over natural gas pipeline tolls proved a stumbling block to Harold Winch (OCF - Vancouver East) and Trade Minister Churchill acceded to his request that it be held over to give time for more study.

The section would empower the board to fix the difference a pipeline company may allow between what it pays for gas and its selling price.

Mr. Churchill said the section was worded that way because legal opinion is that prices of gas sold to consumers can't be controlled in peace time. The section was treating gas as freight on a railway, for example—rates on which are subject to control.

TOO OBSCURE?

Mr. Winch said he had been informed that experienced lawyers feared the section was too obscure. Mr. Churchill agreed to postpone final action on the section until Mr. Winch could look into it more fully.

The government amended another section of the act to spell out its application to pipelines carrying sulphur or sulphur products from oil or gas wells.
