THE HOUSEHOLD.

A Cook's Time Table for Baking and Boiling. So many housekeepers, both young and old, are in doubt as to the right time to cook vegetables and meats that the following table is given, with the hope that it may prove of value to some one.

BAKING MEATS. Beef sirloin, rare—Eight minutes for each pound. Beef sirloin, well done—Ten to fifteen minutes for each pound. Beef ribs or chops—Ten to fifteen minutes for each pound. Beef fillet—Twenty to twenty-five minutes for each pound. Lamb, well done—Fifteen minutes for each pound. Mutton, rare—Ten to twelve minutes for each pound. Mutton, well done—Fifteen to eighteen minutes for each pound. Pork, well done—Twenty-five to thirty minutes for each pound. Veal, well done—Eighteen to twenty minutes for each pound. Braised meat—Three and one-half to four hours. Chickens, weighing from three to five pounds—One to one and one-half hours. Turkeys, weighing from nine to twelve pounds—Three to three and one-half hours. Fish, of average thickness, weighing from six to eight pound—One hour.

CAKE AND PASTRY. Sponge cake—Forty-five to fifty-five minutes. Gingerbread—Twenty to thirty minutes. Cookies—Ten to twelve minutes. Plum pudding—Two and one-quarter to three hours. Tapioca or rice pudding—One hour. Bread pudding—Sixty-five minutes. Pies with two crusts—Thirty to forty minutes. Graham rolls—Half an hour. Wheat rolls—Ten to eighteen minutes. Bread—Forty to sixty minutes. Biscuit—Ten to fifteen minutes.

VEGETABLES. String beans—One and one-half to two hours. Shell beans—One to two hours. Cauliflower—Thirty to forty minutes. Cabbage, new—Thirty to forty-five minutes. Corn, young—Five to ten minutes. Carrots—Fifteen to twenty minutes. Asparagus—Fifteen to eighteen minutes. Onions—Thirty-five to forty-five minutes. Oyster plant—Forty to sixty minutes. Peas—Fifteen to twenty minutes. Potatoes, boiled—Twenty to thirty minutes. Potatoes, steamed—Thirty to forty-five minutes. Turnips—Thirty-five to fifty minutes. Parsnips—Thirty-five to forty-five minutes. New York Record.

Furnishing the Kitchen. Few women are strong enough to keep a bare floor properly scrubbed, and a carpet absorbing the odors and greases of cooking is an abomination; therefore it is a good plan to lay brown oilcloth or the kitchen floor with a material less readily than other colors, and blends better with the woodwork, writes Helen Jay in an article on "Furnishing a Kitchen Home" in the September "Ladies Home Journal." To be sure this is a little thing, but attention to details is the mark of an industrious evolution of a home. In laying this oilcloth the housewife's labor will be lessened if enough more is bought to cover the walls, as well as the floor. If not obtainable in the shops, one can be easily made by taking a dressmaker's stationary or cutting-board as a model. The top of this table should be covered with white marble cloth, and if the closest shelves are covered with the same material they can move easily to be kept clean and sweet. Besides this, table two chairs are needed for the kitchen. They should be made entirely of wood, and as simple as possible, and repairing them expensive work. Small cooking utensils are kept in better condition if hung. A wide, painted board, made after the model of the small keyracks sold in fancy shops, can be hung by means of a nail on the wall, in a position to the edge back of the table. On it, small hooks, such as are used by upholsterers, can be screwed in rows. There is no better holder for knives, spoons and small tinware. Back of the sink should hang the dishpan, soap rack and small scrubbing broom. The ordinary kitchen has two or three chairs. It simplifies the work to devote each of these to a definite purpose. For instance, in one place the ironing board, truss, etc.; in another, everything used in baking, and in a third, the paraphernalia of ordinary work.

Japanese Music. Their music is much more agreeable than that of the other Orientals. They seem to play with some regard to melody, and not with the incessant and wearisome clatter of some of the other countries represented on the Pianissimo. They use no notes, but play by air on drums, gongs, a two-stringed fiddle, and bells. The fiddle is played with a loose hair bow, and has really a surprising compass. The theatrical performance over, they played Yankoo Doodle and other well-known airs in a perfectly recognizable manner, though perhaps not in the very highest style of the art. The fiddler learned the airs by having them whistled to him, and the rest keep time and tune as best they can. Their gongs are said to be remarkably fine. We were told that the gentleman who was making for the Smithsonian Institution a collection of musical instruments of all countries, much admired the Japanese gongs, and said that one of those who orchestra produced as perfect a bass note as he had ever heard. Another instrument which they use looks like a box containing five or six small gongs, which the player strikes with two sticks.—Harper's Bazar.
