

New Parliament Session Not Likely Until Next Year

 OTTAWA (CP) — Whatever happened in Monday's election, Canada's 27th Parliament likely will not be summoned into session until early next year.

The law, the approaching holiday season and the lessons of history all militate against an opening of Parliament before the end of 1965.

The Canada Election Act provides the official election results or writs must be returned to Chief Electoral Officer Nelson Castonguay before the newly-elected MPs can meet.

This took one month after the last election in 1963; the writs were returned May 8 and Parliament opened May 16 less than one month after the Pearson government took office.

Mr. Pearson had promised

during the 1963 campaign to summon Parliament as soon as possible to launch "the 60 days of decision," but he said later this had been a mistake.

RAN INTO TROUBLE

The minority Liberal government was in Parliamentary hot water from the start of the session and it had to withdraw budget bills and the original Canada Pension Plan in the face of stiff criticism.

Whoever forms the next government likely will want more time to prepare the legislative program and let campaign temperatures cool down.

This year, the writs for the Nov. 8 election are to be returned by Dec. 8, leaving little time for sittings before Christmas.

Most likely dates for the opening are late January or early February.

Until then, Commons Speaker Alan Macnaughton will stay in office even though he did not seek re-election in his Montreal Mount Royal riding.

He will not even be in Canada election day. After voting at an advance poll Oct. 30, he left for Geneva and a week-long symposium sponsored by the Inter-Parliamentary Union, which met in the Commons chamber in September.

ILL CONTINUE DUTIES

Mr. Macnaughton, who plans to return to his law practice, will continue to supervise the 1,000-strong Parliamentary staff and exercise other administrative duties of the Speaker until MPs choose his successor.

The Liberals are known to favor Lucien Lamoureux, 45, a bilingual lawyer who served as Deputy Speaker in the last Parliament and who is running again for the party in Stormont.

The next Speaker could become a permanent or continuing one. This means he would be expected to serve for eight or 12 years and be re-elected by acclamation, thus removing him further from partisan politics and enabling him to gain more experience.

This is the custom in Britain and both Mr. Pearson and Conservative Leader Diefenbaker endorsed the idea in principle last session, but they could not agree on a mutually-acceptable candidate.

The custom in Canada has been to elect a different Speaker after every election, alternating English- and French-speaking MPs.

Sukarno May Dissolve Red Party

SINGAPORE (AP) — Fulfilling a wish of his army, President Sukarno of Indonesia was reported to be considering dissolving Indonesia's pro-Chinese Communist party. But he warned in an address to his cabinet Indonesia without communism cannot be united.

Whoever tries to crush communism in Indonesia, Sukarno told the cabinet, is like a man biting his own teeth will be broken.

Sukarno spoke to the cabinet at Bogor Saturday but the final part of his speech, on the Communists, was not broadcast by Jakarta radio until Sunday. Bogor is about 40 miles outside Jakarta.

Since the Oct. 1 coup attempt by pro-Communist and Communist elements, the Indonesian Army has been cracking down on the Indonesian Communist party, regarded as the largest

in the world outside the camp of communist countries.

Sukarno has been reluctant to do so. One of the reasons is that he wants to maintain friendly ties with China. The party fits into his government as part of what he calls Nasakom—a teleological title meaning co-operation among nationalist, religious and communist groups.

Informants in Jakarta said Sukarno will dissolve the Communist party but only under a program for the dissolution of all political parties. Then the plan would be to create a single government-controlled political organization, the informants said.

They added that the army, which now has the say in running the country—may go along with this compromise as the military's main goal is the formal dissolution of the Communist party.

Accountant Faces Charge

BALTIMORE, Md. (AP) — A young accountant has been charged with stealing or embezzling \$1,555,900 from two companies here in three years.

The Baltimore grand jury returned the charges in five presentments against Howard Lee Raley, 30.

An employee of the steamship agency, Ramsey, Scarlett and Company for six years, Raley was accused of taking the money from that firm and from the Baltimore Stevedoring Company, a subsidiary.

The theft-embezzlement presentments include on series of counts accusing him of stealing \$880,500 this year through the use of 29 cheques.

Raley, married and the father of one child, has been in jail in default of \$120,000 bail.
