Thoughts For Our Time

THE MEANING OF CHRISTMAS
We who live at a time after the
coming of Christ cannot really know
the poignant longing of those who
lived before His coming. It is like
so many other good things we have;
we take it for granted. Yet it was
centuries that the Jewish people
waited for the Messiah, sometimes
patiently, sometimes wearily, even
to the point of forgetting the prom-
ise, and forsaking the law of
God. The Jews were a nation whose
customs, laws, worship and men-
tality bespoke expectancy, waiting
for the Saviour, the Holy One of
Israel.

One cannot read the history of
the Jewish people, and the writings
of the prophets without sensing the
paths of their hope. How many of
them were born and died without
seeing the Saviour, living a life sus-
tained by hope. In some passages
the Old Testament reads like the
cry of men in darkness. "Stir up
thy power O Lord, and come to us
who sit in darkness and in the
shadow of death." "Drop down
dew ye Heavens, and let the clouds
rain the Just One: let the earth be
opened and bud forth a Saviour."
Sometimes we are touched by the
patience of a hopeful people "O
Lord, we have patiently waited for
Thee; Thy name, and Thy remem-
brance are the desire of the soul."

The kindness of God toward His
chosen people led Him to speak to
them at intervals through His prop-
hets, to sustain their flagging
hopes, and to comfort them. He
recognize it in the Christmas. For
before their eyes, making the know-
ledge of Him more and more explic-
it, the prospect of His coming more
and more comforting. "Behold a vir-
gin shall conceive, and bear a son,
and His name shall be called Em-
manuel." "Say to the fainthearted:
Take courage and fear not. . . .
God Himself will come and will
save you." "Arise, be enlightened,
O Jerusalem: For thy light is come,
and the glory of the Lord is risen
upon thee." And then, as though
the Saviour had already come, Is-
aiah speaks out joyfully: "For a
Child is born to us and a Son is
given to us, and the government is
upon His shoulder; and His name
shall be called Wonderful, Coun-
sellor, God the Mighty, the
Father of the world to come, the
Prince of Peace."

The Prince of Peace: It is a beau-
tiful title. The Angels caught it up
the night the Saviour was born
and proclaimed it to heaven and
earth: Glory to God in the high-
est, and on earth peace to men of
good will." The first blessing of the
Incarnation was peace; peace be-
tween God and man, between na-
tion and nation, peace in the soul
of each man of good will.

tion passes, the gifts we have re-
ceived and given, pass away. Christ
does not pass away, but remains in
close friendship with us, as long as
we wish Him to. For divine love is
constant, and does not take back
