The NDP increased its share of the vote in all provinces except Newfoundland. It didn't change in the Yukon or Northwest Territories. In British Columbia it captured more of the vote than any other party—33 per cent.

On a country-wide basis the NDP increased its share of the party vote to 18 per cent from 13 in 1963 and its Commons strength to 31 members from 18.

The winning Liberals whose country-wide share of the vote dropped to 40 per cent from 42 in 1963 lost ground in six provinces—Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba and B.C. They stayed even in the others and gained in the Yukon and Northwest Territories.

**GOT BIGGEST SHARE**

Liberals captured the biggest share of the party vote in four provinces, topped by their 64 per cent in Newfoundland. It was 47 per cent in New Brunswick, 45 in Quebec and 43 in Ontario. Compared with 1963, they dropped one percentage point in Quebec, three in Ontario.

Liberals elected 126 members, the same number as in 1963. The Conservatives, whose share of the national vote at 33 per cent was the same as in 1963, scored gains in P.E.I., Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Quebec and Alberta. They stayed even in Newfoundland

and lost ground in Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and B.C. plus the Yukon and Northwest Territories.

Conservatives got 54 per cent of the vote in P.E.I., 50 in Nova Scotia, 46 in Manitoba, 45 in Saskatchewan and 47 in Alberta to lead in those five provinces. They won 99 seats against 95 in 1963.

**GAIN IN NEWFOUNDLAND**

Social Credit got a larger share of the vote than in 1963 in two provinces—Newfoundland, where its two per cent share was all gain, and in B.C., where it rose by five percentage points to 18. It lost ground in New Brunswick, Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta plus the two far-north seats.

It also fell back in Quebec. There, Social Credit candidates won 27 per cent of the vote in 1963. This time the party had nine candidates in Quebec but Creditists obtained 17 per cent of the vote.

On a country-wide basis, Social Credit obtained four per cent of the vote and Creditists an equal share Monday, in 1963, Social Credit, including Quebec, won 12 per cent.

Social Credit elected five candidates and Creditists nine. The Social Credit figure in 1963 was 24.

Other candidates picked up one per cent of the vote last Monday across the country compared with less than half

a percentage point in 1963. Two were elected—an Independent Conservative and a straight Independent—both in Quebec where the "other" share of the party vote amounted to four per cent, all an increase over 1963.

In B.C., NDP and Liberals ran close on the party vote, the NDP getting 33 per cent and the Liberals 30. This reversed the 1963 showing of Liberals 33 and NDP 30.

It was the second time the NDP had gained the largest share of the B.C. vote. They did it in 1962 with 30.9 per cent. The Conservatives led in 1958 with 40.

## Castonguay Gets Ready For Another

OTTAWA (CP)—With one federal election barely out of the way, the order has already gone in for the 500 tons of supplies needed for the next one.

Nelson Castonguay, chief electoral officer, said Thursday it takes six months for the orders to be filled. He placed it right after Monday's election because an electoral officer "hasn't too much choice with a minority government."

When an election returns one party with a majority, an electoral officer "can afford the luxury of taking a rest," he said in an interview. But the job of the officer is "to be able to hold an election at any time."

West led a trump, South cashed the A-K, learning that he had to lose a trump trick. He was then faced with the difficult task of avoiding a spade loser.

He solved the problem by executing an elimination play. After entering dummy with a heart, he took a spade finesse. When the queen held, he cashed the ace of spades, his bid-club, and the remaining heart West refusing to ruff. He then put West on lead with a trump. West had only clubs left and had to play one. This permitted South to discard a spade from dummy as he ruffed in his hand, so the outcome was that South won the rubber and got a bonus of 750 points for making a slam he never should have bid.
