**TORONTO (CP) - Active** uranium and other lower-priced mining issues pushed stock market volume to the second-highest level of the year Monday.  
Active dealings were the rule through almost the whole uranium group and some lower-priced golds and Bathurst issues also came in for heavy play. New Larder U gained 20 cents on the day after favorable rumors about a new base metal property it has acquired in New Brunswick.  
As on Friday, Lorado and Consolidated Denison drew the most attention. Lorado hit a 1954 high of \$2.85 for a 48-cent gain and Denison climbed nine cents.  
Also strong were Sudbury Consolidated, Celtic Metals, Geneva and Consolidated Halliwell. Strong and active in golds were Nib Yellowknife and Dyno. In uranium, senior and junior golds and Manitowague and Bathurst issues were strong at the close but the rest of the market was easier.
