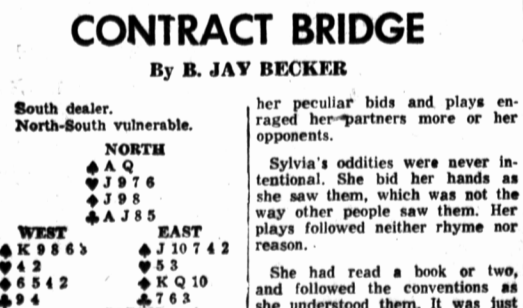

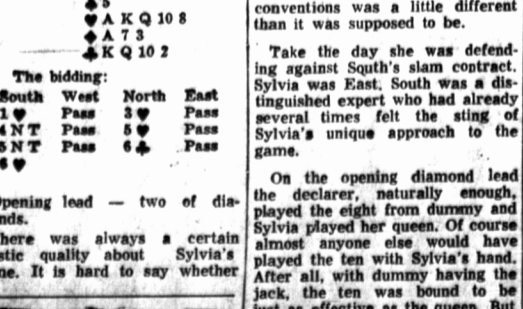

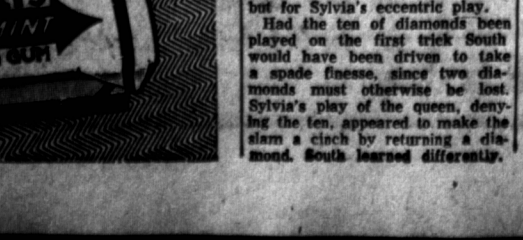

The bidding:
South West North East

her peculiar bids and plays en-
gaged her partners more or her
opponents.

Sylvia's oddities were never in-
tentional. She bid her hands as she
saw them, which was not the way
other people saw them. Her
plays followed neither rhyme nor
reason.

She had read a book or two,
and followed the conventions as
she understood them. It was just
that her comprehension of the
conventions was a little different
than it was supposed to be.

Take the day she was defend-
ing against Squth's slam contract.
Sylvia was East. South was a dis-
tinguished expert who had already
several times felt the sting of
Sylvia's unique approach to the
game.

On the opening diamond lead
the declarer naturally enough,
played the eight from dummy and
Sylvia played her queen. Of course
almost anyone else would have
played the ten with Sylvia's hand.
After all, with dummy having the
jack, the ten was bound to be
just as effective as the queen. But
this was Sylvia.

South won with the ace, drew
two rounds of trumps and re-
turned a diamond. It was obvious
to South that West must have
the ten of diamonds, since if East
had it it would have been played
earlier instead of the queen. De-
clarer played dummy's nine, fully
expecting it to force the king.

Much to South's amazement
Sylvia produced not only the ten
but also the king to defeat the
contract. From South's view this
was simply impossible. All his
vaunted prowess, all his Aristote-
lian logic were put to shame by
this unexpected blow. To add to
South's chagrin he discovered the
contract would have been made
but for Sylvia's eccentric play.

Had the ten of diamonds been
played on the first trick South
would have been driven to take
a spade finesse, since two dia-
monds must otherwise be lost.
Sylvia's play of the queen, deny-
ing the ten, appeared to make the
slam a cinch by returning a dia-
mond. South learned differently.
