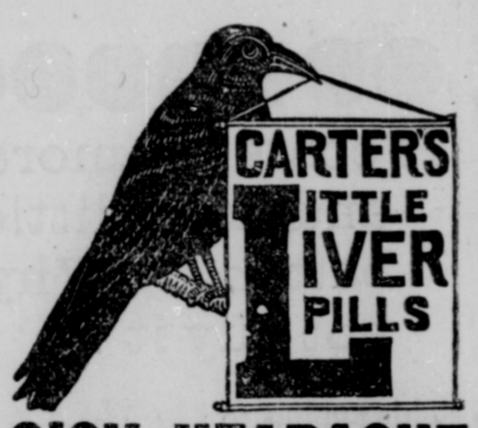
The parapet projecting over the top of the wall and pierced with holes to enable the besieged to attack an enemy close to the foot of the wall, was almost contemporaneous with the wall.
