U. S. Steel

CLEVELAND (AP)—Steel magazine said Sunday a frequently heard estimate on steel production for next year is 75 per cent of capacity.

That would be about nine per cent above the expected 69 per cent this year, said Steel, and would yield 93,000,000 tons of ingots. In only three other years, 1930, 1951, and 1953, has the output been bigger, the magazine commented.

The reason for this predicted rate is that consumption of finished products is expected to be fairly comparable to that in 1954, Steel went on.

"No big expansion in any steel consuming group is expected next year. There may be some variations from this year, but gains and losses are expected to pretty much offset each other."

Right now, said the magazine, steel ingot output is off a half-point, chiefly because of Ohio valley floods and a plant shutdown in the west for installation of new equipment.

The national rate for the week just past was 73 per cent of capacity.

Steel noted a new strength in demand for cold-rolled carbon sheets, used extensively in automobiles. Steel prices are holding steady. The magazine's composite finished steel price was fixed at \$17.85 a net ton.

Scrap, however, showed a composite price of \$32.33. That was 33 cents more than the preceding week.

Urges Aid To Unemployed

TORONTO (CP)—General council of the United Church of Canada Thursday urged its ministers and congregations to help unemployed persons find work.

"Current unemployment in Canada, coupled with the high cost of living, is having a damaging effect on many homes," it said in a statement. "The church has special responsibility for unemployed persons in her fellowship beyond the aid that may be provided by the state."

The church suggested its ministers prepare a list of unemployed persons in their congregations and the type of work they can do.

Quebec Milk Producers Ask Price Increase

MONTREAL (CP)—The United Milk Producers' Association of Quebec Province, Thursday asked the Quebec dairy commission for permission to increase the wholesale milk price by 35 cents per hundredweight to \$4.75.

The association claimed the increase to compensate for what it described as the milk production loss as a result of "the almost catastrophic weather" this year and the resulting conditions of crops, used to feed cattle.

Affected by an increase would be fluid milk markets in Montreal, Quebec City, Trois-Rivieres, Sherbrooke, Theford Mines, Drummondville, Abitibi, Victoriaville, and Shawinigan Falls.

John K. Dickson, vice-president of the Montreal Milk Producers' Association, said about 4,000 farmers supplying milk to the Montreal market have been plagued by the rainy weather.

The dairy commission has taken the association's request under study.

OTTAWA (CP)—Flt.-Lt. Joseph A. Connolly, 31, of Ottawa, former public relations officer for Maritime air command at Halifax, has been appointed deputy director of public relations at RCAF headquarters, the air force announced today.

He will replace Sqdn. Ldr. William Lee, 30, of Hamilton, Ont., who has been appointed head of the public relations organization for the RCAF's air division in Europe. Sqdn. Ldr. Lee will leave for Metz, France, Nov. 1.

POLL OF CANADIAN BUSINESS MEN SHOWS OPTIMISM FOR THE FUTURE

LONDON, Ont. (CP)—A generally cheerful look at the coming year, with some shadings of caution, is expressed in a poll of Canadian business men by the school of business administration of the University of Western Ontario.

These polled are particularly optimistic about the prospects for their own businesses.

A total of 164 executives replied, 111 manufacturing and 53 non-manufacturing. Ontario and Quebec gave 88.3 per cent of the manufacturing answers, larger than their share of the national picture, but 30 per cent of non-manufacturing replies came from other parts of Canada.

Majority opinion is for maintenance or increase in industrial production, and more than half think their individual production will be up. Majority opinion also sees industrial employment as good or better than this year, while half see average weekly wages and salaries at this year's level, and nearly half expect them to be higher. Profits, before taxes, are expected to be maintained or improved.

OPTIMISM DROPS

Optimism drops a bit in the capital expenditures forecast, seven-fifths per cent see capital expenditure for maintenance at 1954 levels or better, but only 56 per cent as hopeful for capital expenditure for expansion, while 35 per cent see a decrease.

Poll results were announced in connection with a panel discussion at the university, entitled, "The experts look at '55." N. R. Crump, vice-president, Canadian Pacific Railway, was chairman; and main speakers were Dr. O. J. Preststone, director of economic research, department of trade and commerce; and Professor Kenneth Galbraith, professor of economics, graduate school of public administration, Harvard University.
