The rebuffs to the criticism of W. W. Hamilton, the member for West Fife, came largely at a closed session. Informants said the Hamilton view generally got short shrift.

## Mr. LeCLAIR Freshmen Announce President

Bill LeClair, an Arts student from Charlottetown, won an overwhelming majority in the Freshmen Presidential election held yesterday at St. Dunstan's University. It was learned last night from Charles McMillan, president of the students' union. A graduate of St. Dunstan's High School, LeClair polled 129 votes of the 216 cast, 59.7 of the total. 75.8 per cent of the voters eligible turned out to vote. LeClair's nearest rival was Jim Carney, who had 52 votes for 24.1 per cent. The other candidate, Ross MacDonald, received 25 votes for 11.6 per cent, while 10 votes were spoiled.

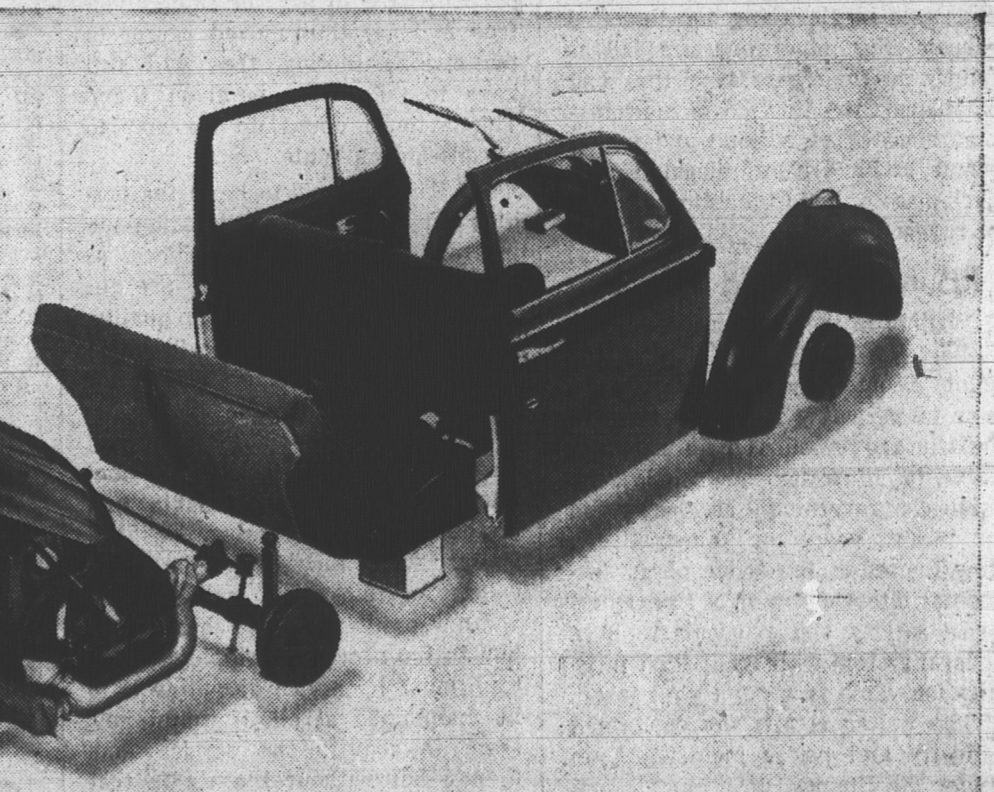
