PROVINCIAL MATHEMATICS COMPETITION

The Department of Mathematics (U.P.E.I.) organizes annually a Provincial Mathematics Competition to select the five Island students eligible to enter the Canadian Mathematical Olympiad. This year the Provincial Competition will be written on March 11 followed by the Olympiad on May 3, 1978.

The Provincial Competition is open to either Grade XII or earlier or freshman students. Student must contact the Mathematics Department prior to March 10.

SAMUEL BRONFMAN FOUNDATION

Eligible candidates must be full-time permanent permanent business faculty members of Canadian universities offering the bachelor's degree in business.

Persons on leave-of-absence for study or research are also eligible for this award. Persons on temporary appointment due to be terminated in the spring or summer prior to the academic year for which the award is applicable are ineligible. A full-time faculty member holding a joint appointment on a business faculty and the faculty of another discipline is eligible. DEADLINE IS MARCH 15.
