## Montague Man Fined On Liquor Selling Count

GEORGETOWN — Raymond Griffin, Montague, was fined \$200 and costs on three months by Magistrate James B. Johnston in Kings County magistrate's court in Georgetown yesterday.

Three Crown witnesses had been heard at an earlier sitting of the case and at yesterday's session the accused, and Dona Amsenall and Richard Riley, Jr., all gave evidence to the defence.

Griffin was represented by J. P. Nicholson and Deputy Attorney-General J. Arthur McGuigan appeared for the crown.

The same accused is also charged with being intoxicated in a public place to which he has pleaded not guilty. The hearing on this charge will take place July 17.

John Francis Laybott, Dingwells Mills, elected trial by magistrate and pleaded guilty to the theft of \$96 from Peter Brake of Souris. He was sentenced to six months in Kings County Jail.

A Cardigan North man, Plus William MacPherson, was fined \$100 and costs when he pleaded guilty to driving while impaired in the future.

Lester Richards of Abney was fined \$23 and costs for having liquor not purchased from a vendor.

For failing to appear in court for judgment, a warrant was issued for John Joseph Johnston, Primrose, to assure his appearance in the future.

The case of Irving Neil Mackay, Murray Harbor, was adjourned to July 31. He is charged with impaired driving.

Two men were fined \$20 and costs for having liquor at a place other than their residence. Another was fined \$20 and costs for being intoxicated in a public place, and two others were fined \$10 and costs for fishing on an enclosed property.

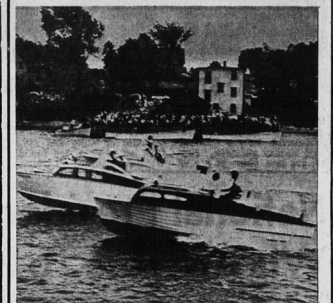
