

Island Truckers Organize Union

A large and enthusiastic meeting of truck owners and truck drivers was held at Summerside, on Saturday. More than 50 people were in attendance.

The meeting was called by the Charlottetown and district Labour Council at the request of a number of the drivers and owners in attendance were Alexander MacLean, chairman of the committee, Staff Sergeant A.J. Dowling, president of the civic Workers Union and Len O'Connor, president of Local 5379, of the United Steel Workers, and members of the council organizing committee, as well as L.K. Abbott, general representative of the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway, Transport, and General Workers.

The chairman pointed out that as the problems peculiar to the trucking industry as it affects both the owner and the driver are more or less a common problem, each being dependent on the other, it is one which can be easiest solved by a well organized group, and both the National Union as well as the Labour Council stood ready to assist in every way.

Before adjournment, it was decided to hold a meeting in Charlottetown on February 16th, and to advertise as before through the press and radio. Mr. Abbott advised that he would again attend, in order to advise and assist the new local in expanding the membership.

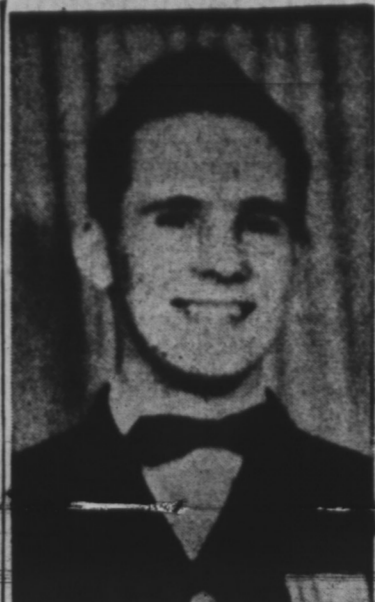

City Airmen Commended

A Charlottetown man, LAC Robert W. Henderson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Henderson, 24 Kent St., has received the Queen's Commendation for outstanding bravery.

The announcement of the citation was made Friday by Defence Minister Peakes.

The 25-year-old airman received the award for displaying great courage under unusual conditions when he and four companions at Chatham air base in New Brunswick, rescued the pilot of a burning plane after a crash that occurred last February.

The commendation read in part "there can be no doubt that without the prompt action of the rescue group the pilot would have died in the aircraft."

The city airman served in the RCN five years before joining the RCAF in 1956. During his tour of duty with the navy he served in the Korean conflict aboard the HMCS Huron. With the RCAF, he has been stationed at North Bay, Camp Borden, Cold Lake, Alta., and Chatham. He is married to a former

New Guide Shows Record Majorities For The Tories

OTTAWA (Special) The latest edition of the Canadian Parliamentary Guide has made its appearance, and it shows some precedent-shattering majorities for Conservative MP's in Prince Edwards Island in the last election.

The 1959 volume of the closely-perused publication contains detailed statistics of the March 31 election and biographical date on all MP's.

The four Conservative members were elected in the four Island ridings with a greater majority than any Tory candidates had ever received in the past.

Only once since Confederation did a Prince County MP have a majority as large as Dr. O.H. Phillips' 3,808. This was in 1935 when the late A. E. MacLean, a liberal obtained a slightly wider margin. It was about 4,100.

Dr. Phillips' increase over his 1957 majority was nearly 3,600. In the latest populous Island constituency, Kings, county, John

OTTAWA (CP)—The Commons is an arena where the sharp retort cuts as deeply as the thunderous denunciation.

Although personalities aren't supposed to cloud its deliberations, members sometimes take advantage of an opening for a thrust at an opponent.

Personal attacks sometimes draw protests. George McRraith (L-Ottawa West) objected to remarks about Opposition Leader Pearson by Trade Minister Churchill, who retorted "I am the only person in this House who was called a louse by a member

of the cabinet when the Liberals were in office."

CALLED A "MUGWUMP"

Another remark that drew a protest came during a debate on the Montreal CBC producers strike. Stating his impression of Labor Minister Starr's attitude towards the dispute, Lionel Chevrier (L-Montreal Laurier) suggested the minister acted like "a mugwump, sitting on the fence with his mug on one side and his wump on the other."

Some get capsule comments into questions. H. W. Herridge (CCF — Kootenay West), who is noted for doing that, in a pro-

nounced British accent described Transport Minister Hees' sure-handed dealing with questions.

"For the enlightenment of the House and the country, I wish to address a question to that noble minister on a sticky wicket, the minister of transport."

Or perhaps they do as J. W. Pickersgill (L-Bonavista - Twillingate) did in correcting a Hansard report that quoted him as saying "jobless figures do not jive." He corrected it to jibe adding that he was not surprised jibe crept in view of the use Mr Starr made of unemployment statistics.

IRKED BY INTERRUPTIONS
Interruption of speakers seems to breed the annoyed personal retort.

Frank Howard (CCF—Skeena), irked by interjected questions from Heward A. Garffney (PC—Brome Missisquoi), suggested "let the honorable member ask his questions in the proper way instead of sitting down on his fancy and yapping."

Mr. Pickersgill took aim at J. C. Van Horne (PC—Restigouche-Madawaska) who has criticized the government and now sits next to the door at the opposite end of the chamber from his former seat near the Speaker:

"Times have changed and we now see the honorable member... perhaps not purged but 'near the door that one more little push would put him out.'"
