

Saints Defeat Devils 1-0; Take Second Straight Win

With two minutes and four seconds of regulation time remaining, Paul MacWilliams slapped home the only goal of the game to give Saint Dunstan's University a 1-0 victory over U.N.B. Red Devils Saturday night. The goal was the climax to a game which saw would-be Saint Dunstan's scorers felled time and again by the sensational goal-tending of Mark Jacobson.

The victory gave the Saints a 2-0 won-lost record. U.N.B. has only one victory in its four starts. The Red Devils had lost 6-4 in overtime to Mount Allison on Friday night.

Peter Kelly, U.N.B. coach, highly disputed MacWilliams' goal. Kelly claimed that one of the Saints was offside on the play and that the goal should have been disallowed. However, the referee didn't see it that way, and that was the game.

The only comment offered by winning coach Jack Kane was, "We won 1-0. We are still playing third period hockey." There was no doubt the local club deserved to win. Were it not for the brilliant play of Jacobson in the U.N.B. net the score might easily have been 6 or 7-0.

The line of O'Donnell, Flood, and Cheverie had the best scoring opportunities of the evening. Rick O'Donnell was probably the most frustrated man on the ice. On at least four occasions O'Donnell looked to have sure goals but Jacobson stole them from him each time. Allen Flood, Joe Cheverie, and Mike

Kelly all had excellent chances but could not put the puck in the net.

Saint Dunstan's goaler Carl MacQuaid turned in a strong performance in blanking the Red Devils. Though he was not called upon too often, MacQuaid was there when needed. This was the first shut-out registered by a goalie in the MHL this season.

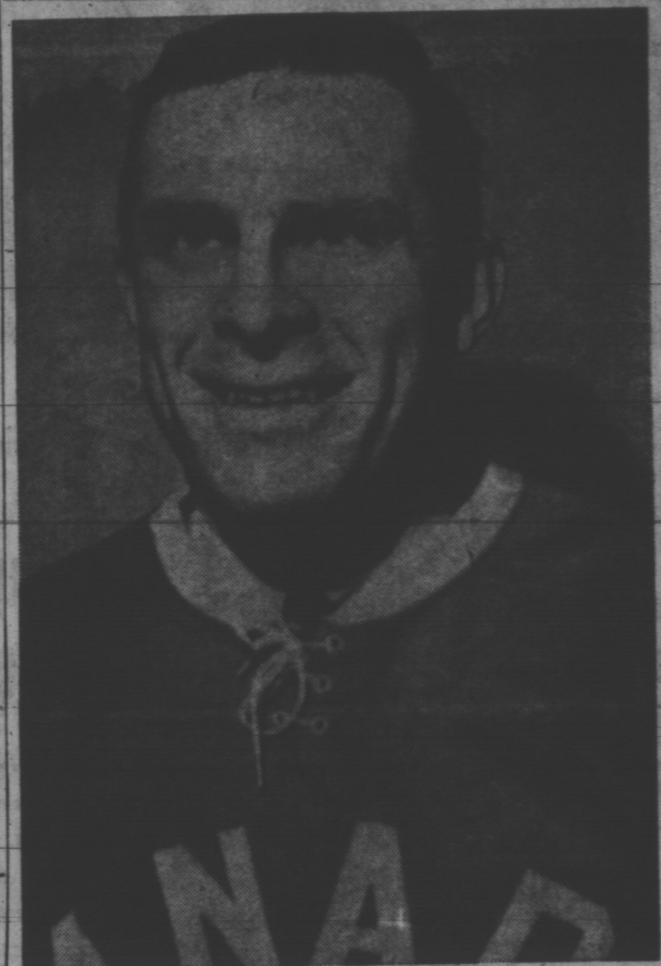
The Saints went with two lines for most of the game. Blaine Jelley looked impressive in his debut on left-wing with Mike Kelly and Paul MacWilliams. A third line saw spot duty during the early part of the game.

Saint Dunstan's must now wait until January 14 for their next game. That will be a big one. It will take them to Antigonish to meet the league-leading X-men.

NEW YORK (CP) — Understanding posted his first stakes victory in 24 starts this year when he won the \$58,000 Stuyvesant Handicap by a nose at Aqueduct race track in New York Saturday.

The three-year-old finished a nose in front of Mrs. Peter Duchin's Mr. Right in the 13-horse field.

Understanding ran the distance in 1:36 and came up from fourth place to earn the purse of \$38,000.

The Hirsch Jacobs-trained entry of Understanding, Flag Raiser and Exhibitionist went off the slight favorite. The entry paid \$7, \$3.20 and \$2.20. Mr. Right returned \$6.60 and \$4.40 and Advocator \$4.40 to show.
