Peruvian Plant Is Announced

MONTREAL (CP)—The republic of Peru and Miner Bayover S.A., subsidiary of the Montreal-based mining firm Midepsa Industries Ltd., have entered into a contract for the development of the Secura brine and phosphate deposits in northern Peru, L. G. Nicol, Midepsa president, said here.

Minera Bayovar owns a 40-per-cent interest in the Secura properties, Mr. Nicol said.

M-F To Merge Spanish Plant

TORONTO (CP)—Massey-Ferguson Ltd. has announced it plans to merge its Spanish interests with Motor Iberica S. A. of Barcelona, Spain's leading tractor and truck manufacturer with production last year of almost 12,000 units.

Under the agreement, Motor Iberica would increase its capital and merge with two Spanish companies — Perkins Hispania S. A., maker of diesel engines, in which Massey has a majority interest, and Motorizacion Agricola S. A., manufacturer of agricultural equipment, in which Massey has a minority interest.

The merger is expected to be completed by fall, Massey said. It is subject to approval by the Spanish government.

Present shareholders of Motor Iberica would receive 55 per cent of the issued capital of the expanded company. Total Spanish holdings, through participation in Perkins Hispania and Motorizacion Agricola, would be 61 per cent while Massey-Ferguson would have 39 per cent.

Steel Output May Surpass 1964 Record

CLEVELAND (AP)—The steel industry of the United States has a good chance of equalling or surpassing last year's record output of 126,900,000 ingot tons, Steel magazine predicts.

But the national metalworking weekly journal notes that labor developments are the big "if" in how 1965 production ends up.

Because steelmakers are planning brisk operations the next several weeks, Steel says, output is headed for a first-half record of about 70,200,000 tons. The previous first-half high of 64,300,000 tons was set in 1959.

Barring an agreement on new labor contracts before Aug. 1—when the United Steelworkers will be free to serve a 30-day strike—notice—third-quarter output should at least equal the record 31,300,000 tons poured in the similar 1964 period, Steel says.

The publication continues: "If it should, the industry will move into the fourth quarter with production of 101,500,000 tons behind it. That'll mean it has a good chance of equalling a year's record 126,900,000 tons."

TORONTO (CP)—Three of the country's leading church leaders — Anglican, United Church and Roman Catholic — called on Canadians to support the \$13,900,000 building campaign for the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto.

Most Rev. H. H. Clark of Winnipeg, primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, Rev. Dr. Ernest E. Long, secretary of the general council of the United Church of Canada, and Most Rev. P. F. Pocock, Roman Catholic primate, Archbishop of Toronto, individually called for help for the hospital.
