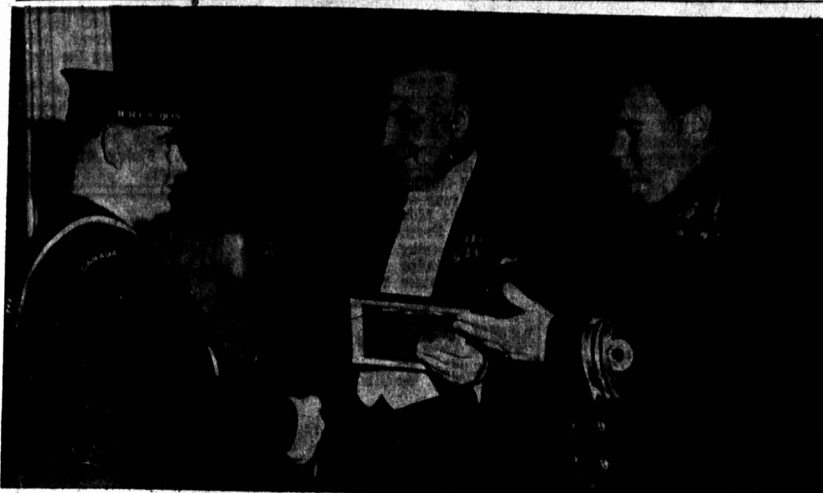

Gets Ovation At Convention

MARGATE, Eng., (AP)—Moderate leader Hugh Gaitskell won a thunderous ovation Wednesday from the Labor party conference and left most of the delegates in little doubt that he is their ultimate party leader.

The 49-year-old up-and-coming Socialist touched off a two-minute demonstration after reaffirming his faith in Socialist ideals and assailing his left wing opponent, Aneurin Bevan.

Gaitskell denied Bevan's assertions that Labor's moderates were "betrayers of Socialist ideals."

He said, "I am a Socialist," he said, "because I hate and loathe social injustice, because I hate the class structure that disfigures our society, because I hate poverty and squalor."

MOUNTBATTENS TO VISIT

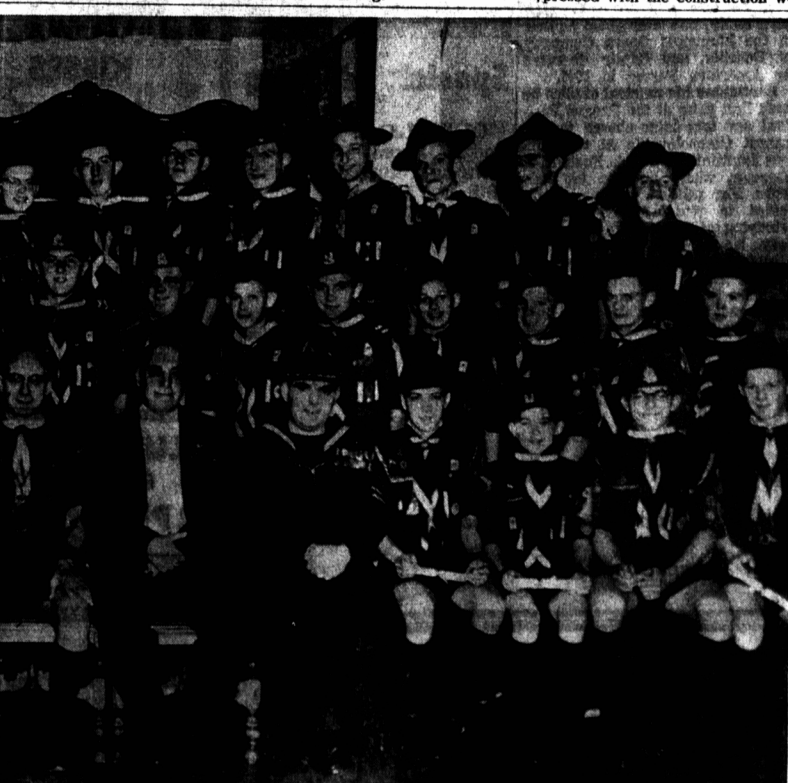
