Hall Happenings

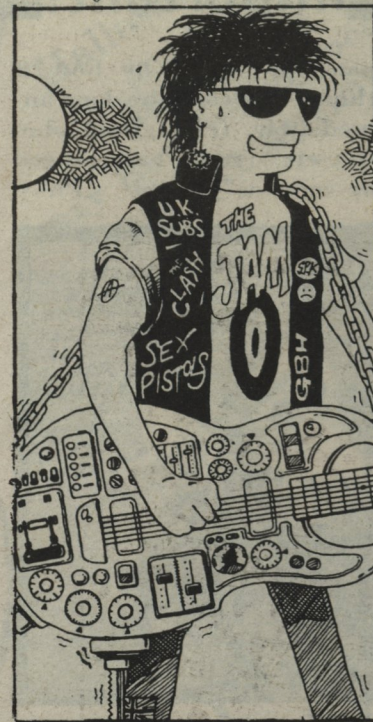
