Excise Case Appealed After Jail Term Given

ALBERTON — An Elmisdale resident, Claude Lester McKenna, was given six months in the Prince County Jail by Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald here yesterday for possession of a quantity of wash contrary to the Excise Act.

In addition McKenna was fined \$500 or in default of payment an additional six months in jail. The conviction is to be appealed and McKenna was released on recognizances of \$500. He was represented by J. Watson MacNaught, QC.

Wilfred Remy Perry, Greenmount, was found guilty of having care and control of a motor vehicle while impaired and fined \$50 and costs. Perry was

also represented by Mr. MacNaught. A fine of \$50 and costs was handed out to Clarence Murphy, Alma, for failing to stop at the scene of an accident. Cecil George Hutt, Alberton South, was fined \$100 and costs for possession of 294 undervalued lobsters while Devere Avery, al-

so from Alberton South, was fined \$10 and costs for possession of 21 short lobsters. Evidence was heard in the case of Jerry Boute, Tignish, charged with possession of 273 undervalued lobsters and the case was adjourned for a decision on July 18.

Cecil Joseph Peters, Tignish Run, was fined \$20 and costs for unlawful possession of liquor and another man was fined \$20 and costs for possession of liquor in a place other than his residence and a third man was fined \$25 and costs on the same charge.

If more than one cultivator is requested, the first one is provided free, with the property owner responsible for additional ones. The department will no longer provide or truck additional culverts and property owners are advised to deal directly with culvert manufacturers where more than one cultivator is requested.

In cases where a road is under construction, the department will place additional culverts if they are brought to the property site by the owner.
Basic culvert measurement is 18 inches in diameter and 20 feet long.
Business property entrances will be treated in the same manner, except that they will be installed to 30 feet of culvert.
In general, the department will supply necessary culverts to schools, churches and halls.

To date, this year, seven traffic deaths have been reported to the provincial motor vehicle branch. This does not include a triple overturning in Summerside on July 4, when a car plunged over the government wharf.
Motor vehicle branch personnel are not sure whether the Bouris tragedy should be classified as a vehicle accident or drowning. However, if it is classified as a motor vehicle accident, triple overturning fatalities total 10 this year.
To the end of July last year, there were three persons killed in traffic accidents.
