UNDER USUAL 'DOOM' CLOUD Money Preparing For '62 Season

ANTIGONISH, N.S. (CP) — Don Loney, the pessimist who loses more cigars than football games, is preparing for the 1962 Atlantic Football Conference season under his usual cloud of doom.
