



## Nurse Director Becomes Medical School Teacher

The resigning director of the Newton Visiting Nurse Association, Miss Katherine MacDonal, left Newton Feb. 7, to become an assistant professor in the Department of Preventive Medicine at the University of Vermont Medical School.

Miss MacDonal served seven years with the U.S. Army Air Force, receiving her discharge in 1952 with the rank of captain. She was a flight nurse with the Military Air Transport Service on the West Coast, flight nurse instructor at San Antonio, Texas, and served with the 801st Troop Carrier Squadron, flying between Korea and Japan.

After her military service, she returned to school and received a Master of Science degree in public health nursing from Western Reserve University in Cleveland in 1953. She became executive director in Newton in December of that year.

She was born in Prince Edward Island, Canada and graduated from Prince of Wales College at Dalhousie University in Halifax with a B.S.c. degree in 1935. She received a Master's degree from the Yale School of Nursing in 1939 and was associated with the Visiting Nurse Association of Baltimore, Md., for two years and

with the Baltimore County Health Department for two years.

Prior to Miss MacDonal's departure from Newton she was the guest at dinner given by her associates at Newton V.N.A. also one given by members of the Board and other friends and was presented with very nice gifts.

Miss MacDonal is a native of Kilmuir, P.E.I. and visits here every summer during her vacation.
