

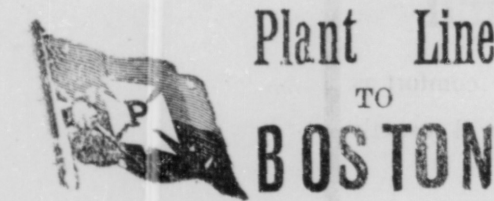
Don't Neglect Your Watch

NOT PARALLEL CASES.

In an able article in The Nineteenth Century on "The Boers and the Native Question" the Rev. Dr. Wirgman, of Grahamstown, who has lived many years in South Africa, forcibly deals with the plea that because the Boers were fighting fiercely for independence they should be allowed to perpetuate and extend their peculiar system of government. He says:—"Mr. Morley is making precisely the same mistake about the Boer war as Mr. Gladstone made in espousing the cause of the south in the American civil war. The southern armies fought with admirable skill and valor. The south fought hard for absolute independence against the supremacy of the more powerful north. So are the Boers now fighting hard against British supremacy. But the gallant fight of the south was in a bad cause, and the successful assertion of southern independence would have meant the triumph of slavery, and the victory of principles inherently evil and absolutely opposed to all human progress. In like manner, the Boers is fighting for an independence which he has abused, and struggling for a freedom to carry on a native policy that is worse than the slavery once practised in the southern States of America. The cause of the Boer is inherently unholy and unjust, and is fundamentally opposed to all true progress and civilization."

To day, near the close of the war, the British Empire feels a thrill of new life in its veins. Distant colonies have come to know one another, and to feel an interest in each other's concerns, their economic advancement, and their mutual happiness and security, as parts of the same Empire. The defence of each part has become a matter of concern to other parts. All this happens because the colonies are free; it could not have happened before the great colonies secured legislative autonomy; it could not happen in the colonies of any other power, because they have not legislative autonomy and are not animated by the spirit of liberty. Recent events in South Africa will form a milestone in the career of colonial progress. A great work of pacification in South Africa lies before the British Government. There are irreconcilables among the Boers now as before, but it is to be hoped that the mass of the Boers can be made accessible to reason. British justice ought to do this, and of British justice they will be assured. At the same time, the services of the loyalists will deserve distinct recognition, in some form; the lessons learnt in the past will ensure this. All will be well when it ends well.—Monetary Times.

The capture of Pretoria by the British, without any attempt on the part of the Boers to defend it from the forts they had built and equipped at such immense cost, will amaze the military writers friendly to the Boers who were let into the secret of these defences. An American writer, who had gone over the forts, said that Pretoria had been prepared to resist a siege of any number of men for three years. Each of the forts which crown the hills surrounding the town had, according to this writer, four heavy cannon, four French guns of fifteen miles range and thirty heavy Gatling guns, besides fifty light gatling guns for the defence, of the minor positions among the hills. Three large warehouses were filled with ammunition and there were large cold storage warehouses, with a capacity for thousands of oxen each. The Boers have, apparently, preferred to dismantle these forts and defend strong natural positions among the mountain districts of the north-east, if forced to do so.
