wartime activities but it was for "Home and Country" the motto of the Women's Institutes which she so often repeated that she gave so many years of outstanding service. She holds the unique record of having attended the Provincial Convention of the Women's Institute for thirty five years. Her long and meritorious service was recognized when she was one of the first women in the Province to receive the highest honor, that of a Life Membership in the Federated Women's Institutes of Canada.

She was always interested in a Sanatorium and worked zealously in promoting the ideas of the need for such an institution and when her desires were realized she was named a commissioner representing the Women's Institutes, an office she carried out with efficiency and conscientious service. For her unwavering devotion and loyalty not only to the Women's Institutes and Sanatorium Commission, but for all her good works, she was the recipient of the much coveted Carleton Medal in 1937.

She was a faithful member of the Presbyterian Church, and as in all other endeavors, she took her religion seriously. For a number of years she was a Sunday School teacher and was a keen Bible student.

By her faithfulness to duty, self-sacrificing character, and above all her readiness to serve in any capacity whether in home, church or state, she won the love and esteem of all and leaves behind a high ideal of womanhood when neither time nor space can obliterate.

The funeral which was largely attended was held on March 7; a short service at the home was followed by service in New Dominion United Church. Rev. Mr. Webster, who officiated, spoke comforting words to the bereaved, and feelingly of the admirable qualities of the deceased. The hymns sung were: "Rock of Ages", "The Lord's My Shepherd", and "Abide With Me" a loving wife, mother, sister and friend was committed to God's holy keeping in the adjoining cemetery.

She is survived by her husband, one daughter, Austina (Mrs. Percy Arbing), two grandchildren, David and Judy Arbing, as well as three sisters viz. Fannie (Mrs. Hector MacDonald) Providence R.I.; Kate (Mrs. George Saunders), Dorchester, Mass.; Jennie (Mrs. A. S. MacNeill) Winnipeg, and one brother, Elliott of Gary, Maine. A sister Constance and two brothers, Richard and S. J. predeceased her.
