TORONTO, (CP)—Stock market prices headed lower Wednesday with golds and base metals striking new lows. The metals dropped more than a point and reached a new low for this year. Golds lost about half a point and reached a new low for 1952-53. Western oils were mixed. Uraniums, New Brunswick base metals and Northern Ontario rare metals weakened. Volume totalled 4,580,000 shares. Gunnar led the losses in uranium, dropping \$1.25. Chimo lost 50 cents and Nesbitt Labine, Rex and Goldfields slipped. New Larder U lost 50 cents and Brunswick dropped \$1. In base metals United Asbestos, Mindamar, Eastern Metals and Steel Corp. slipped. Senior golds weakened. In Western oils Royalite, North Canadian, Cal-and-Ed and Britalta gained while Canada Southern, Canadian Atlantic, Great Plains and Pacific slipped.

Gunnar dropped \$1.25 to \$9 to lead mines lower. Inspiration was down 45 cents at \$2.75 Chimo and United Asbestos lost 30 cents at \$2.70 and \$4.20 respectively and Eastern Metals dropped 28 cents to \$1.82. ISO and Belville weakened. Western oils lost. Lower were Antone, Sweet Grass, Central Leduc and Empire Petroleum. Industrial volume was 42,300 shares and mines 681,100.

WINNIPEG, (CP)—Prices generally closed higher Wednesday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange, reflecting upturns on U.S. markets and lack of good offerings. Flax failed to respond to the late upward trend. Although commercial demand was not too aggressive, there was fair export buying in barley, accompanied by reports of small parcels of this commodity being sold to Belgium. Barley also received light processor support. Domestic shippers took oats in a small way. Flax uncovered an occasional resting order for industrial purposes, while rye attracted some American interests. There was no information available on export loadings of Canadian wheat.
