**Battle Conditions Will Be Simulated**

Battle conditions in the field will be simulated, as nearly as possible, for more than 100 officers and men of the Prince Edward Island Regiment this weekend during Exercise "Prim Light II".

During this exercise a sequel to last year's first edition of "Prim Light", the P.E.I.R. will get two days of practical training in its role as an armored reconnaissance regiment.

The exercise will be held in the Point Prim - Camp Buchanan area. An "enemy force" will have landed near Point Prim, from a disguised fishing fleet, and will be engaged by reconnaissance elements of the P.E.I.R. The exercise will be directed by Major P.G. Kerr, training officer for the regiment.

**PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE**

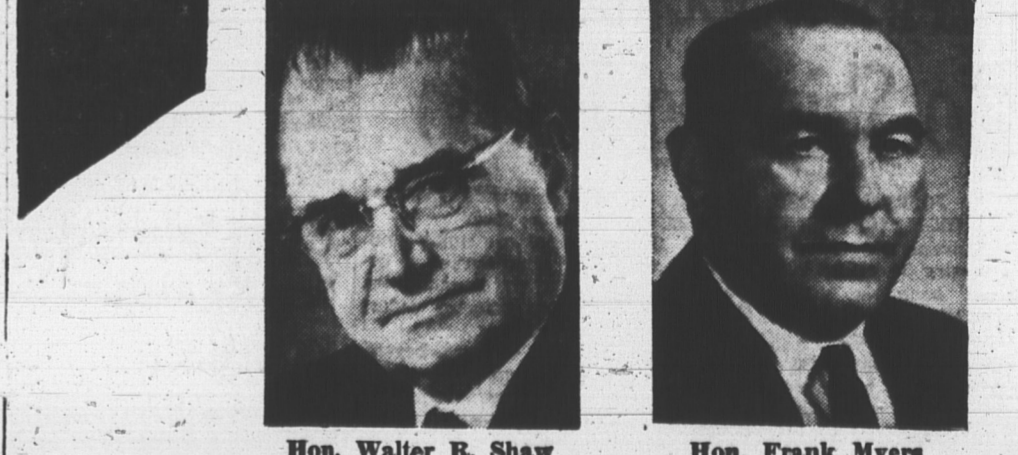
