CLEVELAND (AP) - United States steel mills are expected to increase prices by next week, when steelworkers get a wage increase, and many observers predict the price increase will mark the beginning of another round of inflation. The magazine Steel, a weekly trade publication, predicts the price increase will average \$5 to \$6 a ton of steel. Steelmakers have kept silent on what the increase, if any, will amount to.

N. Y. Stocks In Worst Setback For Five Months

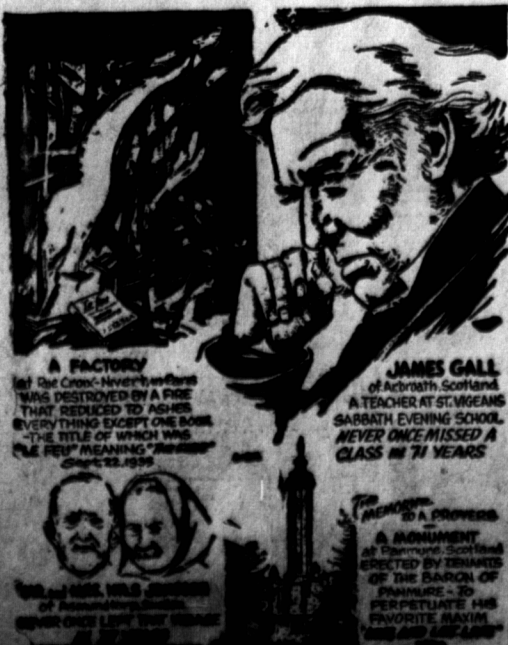
NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market this week suffered its worst setback in five months. The quoted value of stocks listed on the New York Stock Exchange fell an estimated \$5,828,000,000 based on the decline in the average. However, the total value of all stocks listed on the board is about \$220,000,000,000, so the estimated loss amounts to something less than three per cent. The net result was that The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell \$4.70 to \$181.40. This put it below the old 1957 high of \$182.00 reached Jan. 4. It was this high that was pierced on May 9. A series of new 1957 highs was achieved in succeeding weeks, with the peak established at \$186.40 June 1. Coppers took some fair losses on the week, with the International Nickel a big copper producer, off 5%. Kennecott also lost 5%. Anaconda 1/2% and Phelps Dodge 3/4%. The five most active issues this week on the American Stock Exchange were: Jupiter Oils, up 1/4 at 2 1/2 on 175,200 shares; Roosevelt Raceway (when issued), up 1 at 6 1/2; Scurry-Rainbow Oil, off 1/4 at 3 1/2; Fargo Oils, off 1-16 at 15-16; and British Petroleum, unchanged at 22 1/2. The five most active issues this week on the New York Stock Exchange were: Revlon, up 1 1/2 at 29 1/2 on 160,200 shares; American Motors, up 1/4 at 7 1/2; Bethlehem Steel, off 1/4 at 47 1/2; Lukens Steel, up 8 1/2 at 117 1/2; and Standard Oil (New Jersey), off 1/4 at 65 1/2.

FAIR WORKERS STRIKE BRUSSELS (Reuters) - Armed riot police patrolled the 35th world's fair site Friday as more than 2,500 of the fair's 3,000 building workers struck for higher pay. More than 300 building workers from Antwerp, who struck earlier this week, arrived by special train and bus to help Brussels comrades picket the fair building.
