Maritime Conference Is Arousing Interest

The seventh biennial Maritime Conference on Social Work will be held in Charlottetown, with opening sessions at the Charlottetown Hotel on Monday, June 22nd. Sessions will continue through Tuesday and Wednesday at St. Dunstan's University, and will conclude Thursday evening June 25th with a banquet at the Charlottetown Hotel.

Mr. Eugene MacDonald of Charlottetown, director of child welfare for Prince Edward Island, is chairman of the conference.

CONFERENCE ACCENT
The accent on this year's talks will be on the interpretation of social work. This theme will be considered at the opening session on Tuesday morning at the St. Dunstan's University auditorium where Rev. Swithun Bowers, O.M.I., will address the conference on the topic: "What Social Work Is." On the afternoon of the same day, Father Bowers will address the conference on "Social Work - How to Interpret." Discussion groups will be formed to consider these topics under the following: David Weiss, of Baron de Hirsch Institute, Montreal, Fred MacKinnon, deputy minister of public welfare for Nova Scotia, Halifax; Miss Jean Dorgan, consultant in social work with the department of national

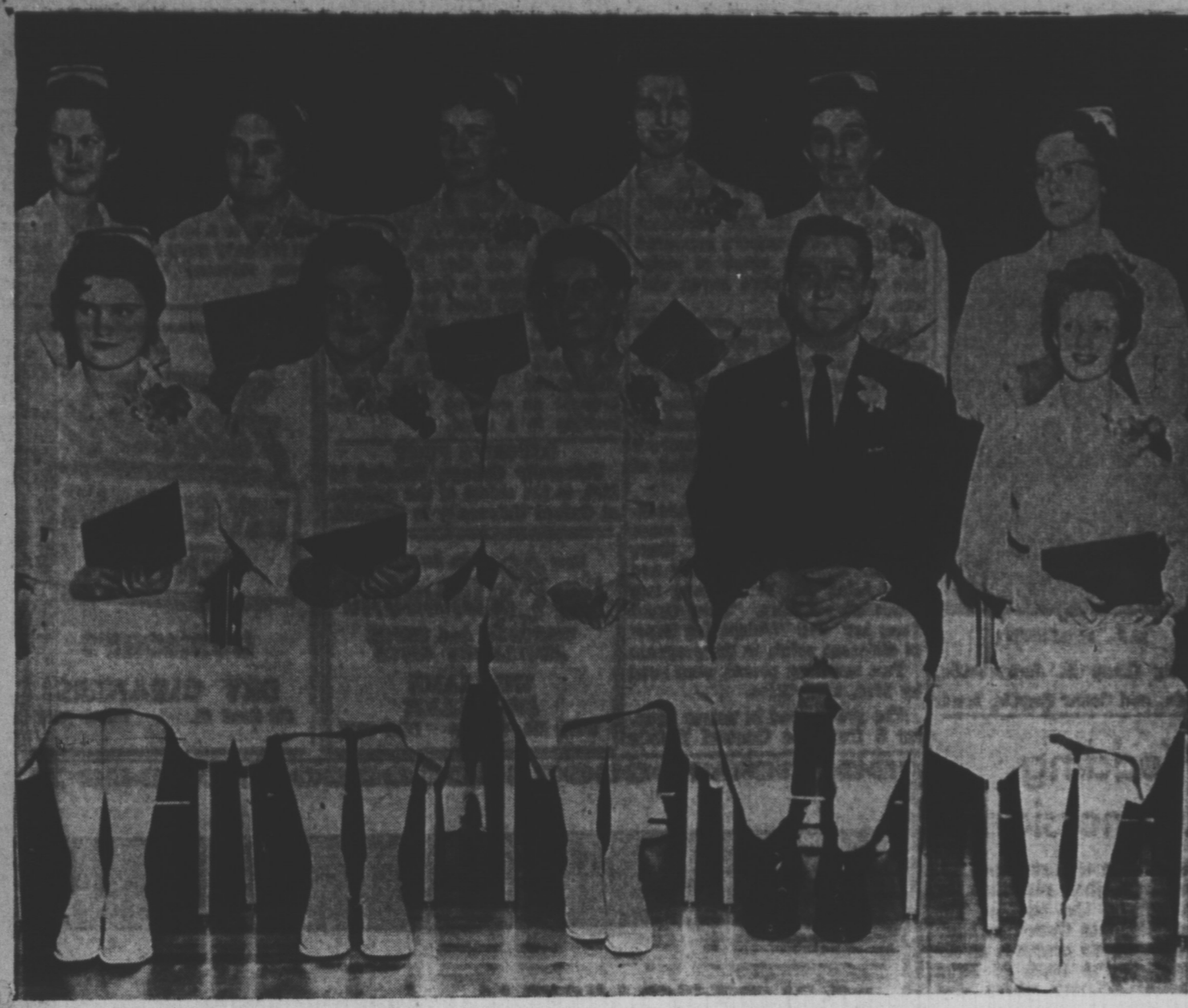
health and welfare, Ottawa; Cuthbert Gifford of the McGill University School of Social Work; Miss Lillian Henderson of the Ontario Welfare Council, Toronto; and Miss Florence Schill, director of public relations with the Toronto Children's Aid Society.

INTEREST GROUPS
The Wednesday sessions will be devoted mainly to special interest groups, including the following: Case work; Institutional care of children; psychiatric case work; board members; child welfare; family agency services; rehabilitation and social security. The conference will conclude Thursday evening with a banquet.
