Million Lost By Strikers

PITTSBURGH (AP)—Striking steelworkers counted up nearly \$100,000,000 in lost wages Thursday—the ninth day of the crippling countrywide walkout. Every day the strike continues, they lost \$10,000,000 in wages. Production losses amount to nearly \$43,000,000 a day and it is cutting deeper into allied fields. The strike of 500,000 steelworkers has cut off nearly 90 per cent of United States steelmaking facilities. In other industries an estimated 45,000 employees have been laid off.
